Vadose zone:

The zone between land surface and the water table where the moisture content is less than saturation (except in the capillary fringe) and pressure is less than atmospheric. Soil pore space also typically contains air or other gases. The capillary fringe is included in the vadose zone. (See Unsaturated zone)

Vapor plumes:

Flue gases that are visible because they contain water droplets.

Vegetative controls:

Non-point source pollution control practices that utilize vegetative cover to reduce erosion and minimize loss of pollutants.

Vision:

Brief statement (usually one sentence) that describes the conceptual image of the desired future. A vision statement describes what your customers expect from you, what you want to be, or what you want the environment that you influence to be.

Volatile Organic Compound (VOC):

A group of chemicals that react in the atmosphere with nitrogen oxides, heat and sunlight to form ozone; VOCs are referred to as hydrocarbons.

Volatility:

The tendency of a liquid to evaporate.
