


North Coast Regional Board Staffing Changes in Last Three years


- 101 positions today versus 81 positions three years ago
 - √ 21% increase
 - √ New positions in Cannabis and SB 901 Programs
- 18 retirements; 7 staff left Region 1 for other positions
- 30 new staff (< 3 yrs) = 35 % of total staff</p>
- 73 % of the Management Team are new to current positions
- 46 % of staff > 10 years; with 27 % > 20 years
