CHRONOLOGY: November 2001 - NPDES Permit Reissued

DISCUSSION: Shell operates a petroleum refinery in Martinez that is owned by

Equilon. The refinery discharges 5.8 million gallons per day of treated

wastewater to Carquinez Strait.

Shell, U.S. EPA, and Communities for a Better Environment (CBE) commented on Board staff's draft permit. We have responded to all comments (Appendix C), and made appropriate changes to the draft permit, all of which are reflected in the attached Revised Tentative Order. We resolved many issues; however, a few remain. The primary

issue was raised by CBE on compliance schedules.

CBE indicates that the proposed compliance schedules in the draft permit are not authorized under the California Toxics Rule or State Implementation Policy (SIP). We disagree. As more fully explained in

our response to comments (CBE comment 3), the compliance

schedules are authorized under the Basin Plan and SIP.
