STAFF SUMMARY REPORT (Lila Tang)
MEETING DATE: April 12, 2006

SUBJECT: **Livermore-Amador Valley Water Management Agency (LAVWMA), Dublin San Ramon Services District (DSRSD), and City of Livermore, LAVWMA Export and Storage Facilities, Pleasanton, Alameda County - Reissuance of NPDES Permit**

DISCUSSION: The Staff Summary Report for this item identified two issues that may be contested by the dischargers. Since that time, we believe we have resolved those issues. The one issue concerning groundwater recharge is proposed to be resolved through revision of the Tentative Order as shown in redline and strikeout below. Additionally, LAVWMA request two additional corrections to the record, also shown below:

1. Revised Tentative Order, Provision VI.C.2.d., page 10
“Special Studies, Technical Reports and Additional Monitoring Requirements.

Within 180 days after the first discharge to San Lorenzo Creek or Alamo Canal, the Dischargers shall submit a technical report, certified by a California registered engineer, including the following information: ...

d. A Study Plan proposal with an implementation schedule acceptable to the Executive Officer to determine the rate and extent of the groundwater recharge of the discharge to Alamo Canal during its entire 20 miles travel to the Bay. The Executive Officer shall have 45 days to review and approve the proposed Study Plan. If the Executive Officer does not comment on the proposed Study Plan during this time period, the Study Plan is deemed approved. The Dischargers shall implement the approved Study Plan, and submit a Final Report within 180 days of approval of the Study Plan. Either a California registered engineer or a professional geologist may certify this portion of the technical report instead of a California registered engineer.”

2. Staff Summary Report for Item 6, April 12, 2006, Board meeting, second paragraph:

“Though the Board has permitted ~~the two~~ one of the discharge points since 1985, and permitted the Alamo Canal discharge since 1999, ...”

3. Revised Tentative Order, Findings II.A. and B. on page 3, and Attachment F (Fact Sheet) I.A. on page 1:

Where it is stated “City of Livermore Water Reclamation Plant” change to “City of Livermore”.
