SUBJECT: Chevron, Richmond Refinery, Richmond, Contra Costa

County – Hearing to Consider Mandatory Minimum Penalty

(MMP) for Discharge of Partially Treated Wastewater to Waters of

the State

CHRONOLOGY: The Board has not previously considered this matter

DISCUSSION: Chevron violated its NPDES permit's effluent limits eight times

during the period between December 1, 2001, and September 30, 2005. Four of these violations are subject to MMPs for a total of \$12,000. This penalty will be suspended since Chevron has chosen

to fund a supplemental environmental project (SEP).

Heavy rains are believed to have caused three of the four violations

(two mercury and one oil and grease) that triggered this

enforcement action. In such events, Chevron has indicated that exceptionally high flow rates may have caused scouring of solids that contained high levels of mercury and oil and grease in its effluent pipeline. In response, we issued a Notice of Violation indicating that Chevron needs to implement a more aggressive maintenance program to remove such solids before wet-weather conditions arrive. The cause of the other violation (heptachlor

expoxide) is unknown.

Chevron has signed a waiver to a hearing (Appendix B), and proposes to undertake a SEP. While the specifics of the SEP have not been resolved at this time, Chevron plans to support creek

restoration work on a nearby stream.
