SHELL MARTINEZ REFINERY, MARTINEZ, CONTRA COSTA COUNTY –Updated Waste Discharge Requirements and Recession of Order

No. 95-234

CHRONOLOGY: Waste Discharge Requirements adopted in 1988 and 1990

Site Cleanup Requirements adopted in 1987

DISCUSSION: The Revised Tentative Order (Appendix A) would rescind and supersede

outdated Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs), update the requirements for continued maintenance and monitoring of closed waste management units (WMUs), and require Shell to update the water quality monitoring program for the WMUs. The WDRs apply to 17 inactive unlined WMUs that have active groundwater monitoring; 5 active unlined ponds; and 5 surface impoundments

to manage stormwater.

The refinery was established in 1913 as a petroleum products terminal, and refining operations commenced in 1916. The refinery currently manufactures various hydrocarbon products including gasoline, diesel, jet, and industrial fuels.

As described in the Response to Comments (Appendix C), staff revised the tentative order circulated for public comment to address submit minor comments submitted by Shell (Appendix B). Shell has indicated acceptance of the Revised Tentative Order. The Revised Tentative Order also includes minor staffgenerated changes. We anticipate this action will remain uncontested.
