**Livermore-Amador Valley Water Management Agency (LAVWMA),
LAVWMA Export and Storage Facilities Intermittent Wet Weather Discharge,
Pleasanton, Alameda County – Reissuance of NPDES Permit**

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DISCUSSION:

This Revised Tentative Order (Appendix A) would reissue the NPDES permit for the Livermore-Amador Valley Water Management Agency's (LAVWMA) intermittent wet weather discharge. This draft permit would regulate the intermittent discharges of secondary-treated and disinfected wastewater to San Lorenzo Creek and Alamo Canal through shallow-water outfalls during extreme wet weather; these discharges could occur up to about once every 1.5 years. The draft permit would also regulate occasional discharge to these waterbodies to ensure outfall operability. LAVWMA owns, and the Dublin San Ramon Services District operates, the LAVWMA Export and Storage Facilities. Most discharges from these facilities occur in Lower San Francisco Bay through a deepwater outfall and are covered under a separate permit.

We did not receive written comments on a draft circulated for public review. We made staff-initiated changes (Appendix B) to clarify monitoring location accessibility. We expect this item to remain uncontested.
