NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT

TENTATIVE CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ORDER

Bremer Family Winery Vineyard, Napa County

San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Water Board) staff has prepared a Tentative Cleanup and Abatement Order (CAO) on March 20, 2017. The Tentative CAO alleges that John Bremer, Laura Bremer, Maryann Nowell and Gregory Nowell (collectively, the Dischargers) are responsible for the unauthorized discharge of fill into an unnamed creek at the Bremer Family Winery Vineyard in Napa County and requires the Dischargers to clean up and abate the effects of the unauthorized fill.

The Water Board is providing a 10-day comment period to allow comments on the Tentative CAO. The deadline for submitting written comments is 5:00 p.m. on March 30, 2017. Comments must be sent to the attention of Agnes Farres. Comments received after the deadline or on any subject other than the Tentative CAO will not be considered.

Pursuant to section 2050(c) of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, any party that challenges the Water Board's action on this matter through a petition to the State Water Resources Control Board under Water Code section 13320 will be limited to raising only those substantive issues or objections that were raised before the Water Board in timely submitted written correspondence delivered to the Water Board.
