5	MR. YOUNG: Folks, we're going to start our
6	meeting today.
7	Good morning, everybody. I'm Jeff Young,
8	chair of the Central Coast Regional Water Quality
9	Control Board. I welcome everybody to San Luis Obispo.
10	Today is October 3rd.
11	And why don't we start with roll call.
12	Mr. Harris.
13	MR. HARRIS: Mr. Young?
14	MR. YOUNG: Present.
15	MR. HARRIS: Mr. Jeffries?
16	MR. JEFFRIES: I'm here.
17	MR. HARRIS: Mr. Delgado? He's absent.
18	Dr. Hunter? Dr. Hunter is absent.
19	Mr. Johnson?
20	MR. JOHNSON: Present.
21	MR. HARRIS: Mr. Jordan?
22	MR. JORDAN: Present.
23	MR. HARRIS: Dr. Wolf?
24	DR. WOLFF: Present.
25	MR. YOUNG: Thank you. Let's move on to

1	introductions.
1 2	Mr. Harris.
2 3	MR. HARRIS: Advising and assisting the board
	today is Ms. Jessica Jahr, counsel to the board;
4	
5	technical staff to my far right, including Mr. John
6	Robertson and Mr. Ryan Lodge, and that's it. Okay.
7	MR. YOUNG: Okay. Item No. 3.
8	Mr. Harris.
9	MR. HARRIS: Item No. 3 is a continuation of
10	the hearing begun on September 7, 2012, concerning
11	Administrative Civil Liability Complaint R3-2012-0030.
12	The complaint alleges that the San Luis Obispo County
13	Sanitation District caused untreated wastewater
14	discharges to surface waters of the United States on
15	December 19 and 20, 2010. The alleged discharges are
16	violations of the California Water Code and Federal
17	Water Pollution Control Act.
18	MR. YOUNG: Okay. What we've decided to do
19	for today is to have Mr. Nicolls give us his public
20	comments for three minutes, and then we're going to
21	adjourn the meeting and go into closed session for
22	deliberations.
23	What we've decided to do is to allow
24	Mr. Nicolls to give his comments as a member of the
25	public and not as a member of the district, with the

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1	admonition that we do not want to have you commenting on
2	any of the evidence that you've heard that took place
3	during the proceedings, and the reason for that was, as
4	a board member of the district, you have, obviously,
5	your own knowledge of what's been going on with the
б	district, and to keep things out of the realm of you
7	saying something, maybe, that the prosecution team would
8	feel was inappropriate and that they would want to
9	possibly cross-examine you on to set everything fairly,
10	we want to avoid that, and so as a member of the public
11	you're welcome to give your comments in terms of policy.
12	So that's what we decided to do, Mr. Jeffries.
13	MR. JEFFRIES: All right.
14	MR. YOUNG: We'll have to swear you in.
15	
16	WILLIAM NICOLLS,
17	having been sworn, was examined and testified
18	as follows:
19	
20	MR. YOUNG: Thank you. Go ahead.
21	MR. NICOLLS: I thank you very much for
22	allowing me the opportunity to speak to you.
23	The comments that I have are comments that I
24	had formulated in my mind prior to your hearing, so what
25	I have to say really has nothing to do with evidence

that was represented at the hearing.

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2 I live in Grover Beach, I am on the Grover 3 Beach City Council, have been for six years now. Ι 4 currently function as the mayor pro tem, and as part of 5 my responsibility with the City of Grover Beach, I sit on the board of directors of the South San Luis Obispo 6 7 Sanitation District. As part of the board of directors of the district, I am currently the chairman of the 8 9 board. I have been on that board for approximately four 10 years now.

11 I would like to comment that I speak to you 12 today as a citizen, resident of Grover Beach. I would like to impress upon you the need to be fair and 13 14 equitable in your decision on this matter. I'm a 15 ratepayer, as is everybody else in the three agencies that comprise the South San Luis Obispo Sanitation 16 17 District. Any substantial fine that comes from this 18 situation is going to adversely severely affect all of 19 the ratepayers within the three agencies that comprise 20 the district.

So I ask you, I've looked at some past cases that this Board has heard, I did a little bit of research on my own, and I know in the past I have looked at cases where it appears to me that you have been fair and equitable. I would hope that you will proceed with

your deliberations on this case with that same thought 1 2 in mind, that whatever comes out of this is going to go 3 to the ratepayers, because that's the way we operate, 4 that's the way we're set up there. So please keep that 5 in mind and proceed with your deliberations. I would also like to mention to you and remind 6 7 you that you did receive a letter, which I got a copy of, dated September 4, from the mayor of Arroyo Grande. 8 9 He was unable to appear here in person, but he submitted 10 a letter to you. I have read that letter. I think he 11 has made some outstanding points. I almost chose to 12 read that letter for him, but I decided not to do that; I would simply encourage you to please take a look at 13 14 that letter, read it. I think he makes some outstanding 15 points in it that will help you in your deliberations. 16 I thank you very much for the opportunity to 17 appear here. 18 Thank you for your comments. MR. YOUNG: Okay, that concludes the remaining item that 19 20 we need to cover before adjourning and going into closed session. So we'll now do that. 21 22 MR. HARRIS: Just for the audience's information, I think what Ms. Jahr talked about 23 yesterday was at some point around lunchtime we would 24 25 like to have someone come back and give everyone an idea

1	of how much longer it's going to take so they can go out
2	and have lunch.
3	MR. YOUNG: Okay. And we do have a personnel
4	matter that we're going to be dealing with, so we're
5	going to stop at 11:00 to deal with that.
6	MR. HARRIS: So I think we would come back at
7	about 12:30 and let everybody know where we are.
8	MR. YOUNG: All right, thank you very much.
9	(Recess)
10	MR. YOUNG: All right, we're back out of
11	closed session and we do have an order that is being
12	photocopied right now which we're going to distribute to
13	everybody. Because Mike Jordan needs to leave very
14	soon, we want to quickly let staff run us through the
15	changes we have made to the draft order that we will all
16	look at up on the screen, instead of waiting to vote,
17	and then we'll have a vote and then we'll have the paper
18	version as soon as it comes down.
19	So, John, why don't you go ahead and put the
20	draft order on the screen and lead us through the
21	changes that we've made to it.
22	MS. JAHR: John is actually going to be
23	looking at the draft penalty calculator methodology
24	because it's a shorter version of the draft order.
24 25	MR. YOUNG: Okay.
J	rat. 100md. Okay.

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1	MR. ROBERTSON: Okay, this is the enforcement
2	policy. I'm going to scroll up to the top.
3	The penalty calculation methodology worksheet,
4	this works through the different factors and steps of
-	the enforcement policy.
6	Step 1 is the potential for harm factor, which
7	is the sum of this factor here (indicating). Ten is the
8	sum of the selected factors up here (indicating) that
9	is, a sum of 5, 4 and 1.
10	Let me open up to step 1. This reflects the
11	harm or potential harm for beneficial users. The
12	physical and chemical, biological and thermal
13	characteristics of the discharges is a factor 2.
14	Let me step back and say factor 1, the Board
15	selected a value of 5; for the physical, chemical,
16	biological and thermal characteristics of the discharge,
17	factor 2, the Board identified a factor of 4; and for
18	the susceptibility of cleanup, factor 3, the Board
19	selected a score of 1. That sums the items right here
20	(indicating).
21	Step 2 identifies the per-gallon assessment
22	for the discharge. The Board identified a moderate
23	deviation from the requirement, and that, factored with
24	the previous potential for harm, comes to this .6 value
25	here on the spreadsheet (indicating).

1	The Board had four discharge volumes to
2	evaluate and determined that the 674,400 gallon
3	discharge volume was the most representative, based on
4	the evidence before them.
5	There were two days of discharge, so that
6	entered into this factor here (indicating), \$10,000 per
7	day, and for the per-day factor, the deviation from
8	requirement and potential for harm factored there was
9	assessed at .6 as well, and that is right there
10	(indicating).
11	Moving down to step 4, with respect to the
12	culpability factor, based on the evidence, the Board
13	determined a factor of 1.4.
14	With respect to the cleanup and cooperation
15	factor, factor 2 of step 4, the Board made a
16	determination of 1, 1.0 for that factor. That's right
17	there (indicating).
18	And then for the history of violations, the
19	Board made a determination of 0.9 for that factor.
20	The Board also added staff costs of \$75,000 to
21	this total final liability of \$1,109,812.80.
22	MS. JAHR: Do you have extra copies?
23	MR. YOUNG: If you'd like a copy, raise your
24	hand and we'll pass that to you.
25	Any Board comments before we take a vote? We

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1	don't have a motion yet. Does anyone want to go
2	ahead, make a motion.
3	MR. JORDAN: Mr. Chair, I move that after
4	consideration of the evidence and according to the
5	findings presented in the draft order, that the Board
6	approve Draft Order R-32012-0041.
7	MR. YOUNG: Okay.
8	MR. JEFFRIES: Second.
9	MR. YOUNG: Any comments on the motion?
10	Okay. Seeing none
11	And by the way, folks, a lot of the rationale
12	that went into what we did in terms of calculating the
13	penalty is contained inside the draft order itself, so
14	if you get a copy of this, you can look into what we
15	determined for why the volume we thought was
16	appropriate, why we settled with it, the 674,000 gallon
17	figure, the rationale is in there.
18	Also the degree of culpability, we looked at
19	that, because that has a big effect on the bottom-line
20	number. Our rationale for that is contained in the
21	draft order on page 8.
22	So I will call for a vote.
23	All those in favor of the motion say "aye."
24	Anyone opposed to the motion say "no."
25	Okay, motion carries unanimously.

1	All right, so that's it. We're completed with
2	this agenda item.
3	Mr. Jordan, you can run out now.
4	That concludes our meeting. Thank you very
5	much.
