> Due to medical issues (I am legally disabled by a serious medical condition and and currently suffering a flareup) it is unlikely that I could appear at an RWQCB public forum or proceeding. I ask that reasonable accommodation be made for my disability by providing me with a means of submitting my specific request to the Board without being physically

present. Please tell me how this will be accomplished. > Regarding the fact that Mr. Harris's staff looked into the issue, if you read my two recent emails to Mr. Harris, then I believe the very serious logic flaws in the staff's work are glaringly apparent. Frankly, I am forced to conclude that either they are not competent, or that they were making a deliberate attempt to be deceptive. > If they are being deceptive, perhaps that is because RWQCB staff oversaw the MBTE mitigation effort and would thus be held responsible for the well nitrate problem if they admitted what is, to many of us, glaringly obvious. > I urge you to read the two emails sent to Mr. Harris. You were on the CC list. If you read them with an open mind, I believe you will clearly see the problem. I urge Mr. Harris to read them too. His staff's arguments are so illogical that they would be laughable were this not a serious situation. I say this as an educated person with a degree in mathematics and a 31-year career in software development. I can spot a logic flaw a mile away, and the RWOCB staff's conclusions contain some pretty serious ones. The steps in the process are as follows. You must appear before the regional board at its public forum or some other appropriate proceeding and make a specific request of the Board. If the Board declines to act or you disagree with the Board's action, you can petition the action or inaction to the State Water Board. The Central Coast RWQCB oversaw the entire MTBE remediation process and undoubtedly has a huge file on the subject. It does not appear that Mr. Harris' analyst looked If he/she had, it would have been clear that there was a >> at it. >> significant hydraulic connection even before the extensive excavations at the site. >> >> Mr. Howard, over the years there have been many complaints by Morro Bay residents and other residents of SLO County regarding the RWQCB. There have been many allegations that they are too closely tied to the local political machine and would do anything for that machine, including ignoring and even covering up violations. While Mr. Harris, as you told me, may bring a "new perspective", many people here believe that it is obvious that his staff still has the old perspective. >> >> The flawed analysis done by Mr. Harris' s analyst is just one example. >> Another RWQCB staff member still refuses to do anything about unpermitted septic systems in the Chorro Valley - systems that are

malfunctioning and polluting ground water in that area. That same staff member refused to take action several years ago when I provided irrefutable evidence that storm water runoff was being deliberately funneled through a City park and dumped into a creek that flows directly to the ocean. He told me that, while that was not the right way to do things, he would not force the City or the developer who was responsible to fix the problem. >> >> Another RWQCB staff member steadfastly insisted on the accuracy of a consultant's report on the Morro Basin nitrates despite having serious logic flaws pointed out to him. I ask that, in addition to my earlier email on the subject, you review the attached documents. I believe you will see the problem. >> >> Please take whatever action is necessary to ensure that staff of the Central Coast RWQCB does not continue to allow the ongoing pollution of >> our groundwater.
