SUBJECT: Enforcement Report

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DISCUSSION

This staff report includes a summary of the Enforcement Team's recent enforcement actions taken from April 1, 2017 to July 31, 2017. Tables 1 through 5 include summaries of Administrative Civil Liability Orders issued, Cleanup and Abatement Orders issued, Cease and Desist Orders issued, Notices of Non-Compliance for Industrial or Construction Storm Water General Permit Annual Reporting or Enrollment issued, and Notices of Violations. During this time period, staff did not issue Expedited Payment Program Letters (EPLs; Settlement Proposals for Mandatory Minimum Penalties per the Water Code or for Other Non-Controversial Issues), or Time Schedule Orders.

This staff report also includes a summary of violations reported by dischargers from January 1, 2017 through May 31, 2017. These violations are currently under review by program and enforcement staff to assess priorities for potential future enforcement. A general description of the different types of enforcement actions that can be taken by Water Board staff are provided in Attachment 1, and a detailed description is provided in the <u>State Water Board Water Quality</u> <u>Enforcement Policy</u>. Definitions of abbreviations used throughout this staff report are available in Attachment 2.

<u>Summary:</u> ACL Order No. R3-2017-0009 issued May 4, 2017, imposing mandatory minimum penalty for five violations of NPDES permit effluent limitations. The compliance project consists of constructing a test pond and four lined treated wastewater evaporation ponds, a concrete wet well, pump stations, buried pipelines, and associated electrical systems. The penalty amount of \$15,000 will be spent on building the test pond. After the overall project completion, the District will no longer discharge to surface waters and therefore will not require a NPDES permit and will not be subject to further mandatory minimum penalties. Instead, the Water Board will regulate the District via Waste Discharge Requirements as a discharge to land.

Water Board staff uses the California Integrated Water Quality System (CIWQS) to track Water Board data, including violations and enforcement actions. For the time period between January 1, 2017, and May 31, 2017, Water Board staff observed the various categories of violations summarized below. While some of the violations included in the table below may have already been addressed in the recent enforcement actions listed above, a majority of these violations do not correlate with the above enforcement actions. Program and Enforcement staff are currently reviewing these violations to assess priorities for potential future enforcement.
