SUBJECT: Enforcement Report

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DISCUSSION

This staff report summarizes the enforcement actions taken from August 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017. Tables 1 through 4 include summaries of issued Administrative Civil Liability Orders, Expedited Payment Program Letters to resolve mandatory minimum penalties issued, Notices of Non-Compliance for Industrial or Construction Stormwater annual reporting or enrollment violations, and Notices of Violations covering various programs. Violations considered during this time period did not require staff to issue Cleanup and Abatement Orders, Cease and Desist Orders, or Time Schedule Orders.

This staff report also includes a summary of violations reported from June 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017. These violations are currently under review by program and enforcement staff to assess their validity, priority, and potential for future enforcement actions.

A general description of the different types of enforcement actions that Water Board staff may take are provided in Attachment 1. Definitions of abbreviations used throughout this staff report are available in Attachment 2. Detailed descriptions of each enforcement action are provided in the 2017 Water Quality Enforcement Policy. The Enforcement Policy was recently amended and became effective on October 5, 2017. The amendments clarify certain principles that are central to the Enforcement Policy to ensure more transparent and consistent application of the statutory factors the Water Boards must consider when assessing a civil liability. The amendments also change the case prioritization and violation ranking process to make this more efficient and consistent throughout the state. The amendments also bring greater global transparency to the Water Boards' enforcement process and penalty methodology application.

VIOLATIONS PENDING FURTHER ENFORCEMENT STAFF REVIEW (June 1, 2017 – September 30, 2017)

Water Board staff uses the California Integrated Water Quality System (CIWQS) and the Storm Water Multiple Application and Report Tracking System (SMARTS) to track Water Board data, including violations and enforcement actions. For the period of June 1, 2017, through September 30, 2017, Water Board staff observed the various categories of violations summarized below. While the recent enforcement actions listed above may address some of the violations included in the table below, a majority of these violations do not correlate with the above enforcement actions. Program and Enforcement staff are currently reviewing these violations to assess priorities for potential future enforcement.
