AMENDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS for Los Angeles By-Products Company

> (Penrose Landfill) (File No. 58-192)

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region finds:

- 1. Los Angeles By-Products Company owns a 72 acre, Class III waste disposal facility located at 8301 Tujunga Avenue, Los Angeles, California, and has filed a Report of Waste Discharge with this Board and applied for waste discharge requirements which are necessary to meet Chapter 15 Closure Requirements. Landfilling operations ceased in March, 1985.
- Penrose Landfill is a closed, 72 acre Class III (former Class II-2) daily cover type landfill reclaiming a depleted sand and gravel quarry in the Sun Valley District, City of Los Angeles, California. The landfill operated under two Regional Water Quality Control Board Resolutions. The approximately 24 acre site covered by Resolution No. 58-92, commonly known as Site No. 7, is located adjacent to 8221 North Tujunga Avenue, Los Angeles, California, and the approximately 50 acre site, commonly known as Site No. 8 is located adjacent to 8145 North Tujunga Avenue, Los Angeles, California. Areas within these sites, that could be maintained at least 10 feet above the anticipated high ground water level, were allowed to receive Class II waste materials with the provision that adequate facilities be provided to protect the proposed dump site from surface runoff.
- 3. Los Angeles By-Products Company, successor company to Consolidated Rock Products Company, purchased the site on March 5, 1974, and all records from that period forward indicate Penrose as one disposal site.
- 4. This site is now vacant, except for a gas extraction/power generating plant.
- Ground water monitoring has been in place since June, 1985.
 The Solid Waste Water Quality Assessment Test (SWAT) analysis

was completed on July 1, 1989, and was approved by this Board on September 22, 1989. Monitoring data indicate the landfill is not adversely affecting ground water quality.

- 6. This amendment combines the separate areas covered by Resolution Numbers 58-92 and 58-93 to reflect the closure as a single site. No visual boundaries are in evidence. Closure Plans have been submitted closing the site as one site.
- 7. The Post-Closure land use of this landfill will be a golf course or other recreational use.
- 8. The amendment of this waste discharge requirement is exempt from Public Resources Code 21100 et seq. as an existing facility pursuant to Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15301.

The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to amend waste discharge requirements for this discharge and has provided them with an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.

The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertinent to the discharge and to the amended requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Paragraph 2 of Resolution No. 58-92, adopted December 18, 1958, is amended to read:

- A. Penrose Landfill, a 72 acre parcel, is located at 8301 Tujunga Avenue, Los Angeles, California, and consists of Site No. 7 and Site No. 8.
- B. All other Requirements, Limitations, and Provisions of Resolution No. 58-92 are unchanged and shall remain in full force and effect.
- C. Resolution No. 58-93 is hereby rescinded.
