**ADOPTED WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS AND NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT, DONALD T. STERLING CORPORATION, STERLING AMBASSADOR TOWERS, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CA0053091, CI NO. 5839)**

Our letter dated July 13, 2010, transmitted the tentative waste discharge requirements for renewal of your permit to discharge wastes under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES).

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Water Board at a public hearing held on October 7, 2010, reviewed the tentative requirements, considered all the factors in the case, and adopted Order No. R4-2010-0180 (copies enclosed) for your waste discharge. Order No. R4-2010-0180 serves as your NPDES permit and expires on September 7, 2015. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that an application and Report of Waste Discharge for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date.

You are required to implement the Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) on the effective date of this Order. The dates that the monitoring and annual reports must be received at the Regional Water Board Office are provided in the MRP. When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Water Board, as required by your "Monitoring and Reporting Program", please send them ATTN: Information Technology Unit and include a reference to "Compliance File No. 5839" for the Sterling Ambassador Towers. This will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

The complete final Order and Permit will be sent only to the Discharger. However, these documents are available on the Regional Water Board's website for your review. The Regional Water Board's web address is [www.waterboards.ca.gov/losangeles/](http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/losangeles/).


