The discharger shall implement this monitoring program on the effective date of this Order. The first monitoring report under this program is due by July 15, 1992.

Monitoring reports shall be submitted by the dates in the following schedule:

Effluent Monitoring

A sampling station shall be established for each point of discharge and shall be located where representative samples of the effluent can be obtained. The following shall constitute the effluent monitoring program:

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

FOR

BROADWAY SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA
(Broadway Stores - Glendale Galleria)

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, finds:

1. Broadway Southern California, a division of Carter, Hawley, Hale Stores Incorporated, discharges wastewater under waste discharge requirements contained in Order No. 86-30 (NPDES NO. CA0057720) adopted by this Board on June 23, 1986.
2. Broadway Southern California has filed a report of waste discharge and has applied for renewal of its waste discharge requirements and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit.
3. Broadway Southern California operates Broadway - Glendale Galleria, a retail department store, at 650 West Broadway, Glendale, California, and discharges up to 270 gallons per day of cooling tower bleed-off to a storm drain in Broadway. The wastes flow to Los Angeles River, a water of the United States, at a point near Goodwin Avenue, above the tidal prism.
4. All other wastes are discharged to the community sewer system.
5. The Board adopted a revised Water Quality Control Plan for Los Angeles River Basin June 3, 1991. The Plan contains water quality objectives for Los Angeles River.
6. On April 11, 1991, State Water Resources Control Board adopted Water Quality Control Plan for Inland Surface Waters. This plan contains narrative and numerical water quality objectives.
7. The requirements contained in this Order, as they are met, will be in conformance with the goals of the Water Quality Control Plans.

8. The beneficial uses of the receiving waters are: groundwater recharge, water contact and non-contact water recreation, warm fresh water and wildlife habitats, and (within the tidal prism) industrial service supply, ocean commercial and sport fishing, preservation of rare and endangered species, marine habitat, shellfish harvesting, and saline water habitat.
9. The issuance of waste discharge requirements for this discharge is exempt from the provisions of Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 21100) of Division 13 of the Public Resources Code in accordance with Water Code Section 13389.

The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for this discharge and has provided them with an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations. The Board in a public hearing heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge and to the tentative requirements.

This Order shall serve as a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit pursuant to Section 402 of the Federal Clean Water Act, or amendments thereto, and shall take effect at the end of ten days from the date of its adoption provided the Regional Administrator, EPA, has no objections.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Broadway Southern California, in order to meet the provisions contained in Division 7 of the California Water Code and Regulations adopted thereunder, and the provisions of the Federal Clean Water Act and regulations and guidelines adopted thereunder, shall comply with the following:

I. Effluent Limitations

1. Wastes discharged shall be limited to cooling tower bleed-off only, as proposed.
2. The discharge of an effluent in excess of the following limits is prohibited:

II. Receiving Water Requirements

1. Inland surface water communities and populations, including vertebrate, invertebrate, and plant species, shall not be degraded as a result of the discharge of waste.
2. The natural taste and odor of fish, shellfish, or other inland surface water resources used for human consumption shall not be impaired.
3. Toxic pollutants shall not be discharged at levels that will bioaccumulate in aquatic resources to levels which are harmful to human health.
4. The concentration of contaminants in waters which are existing or potential sources of drinking water shall not occur at levels which are harmful to human health.
5. The concentrations of toxic pollutants in the water column, sediments, or biota shall not adversely affect beneficial uses.

III. Requirements and Provisions

This Order includes the attached "Standard Provisions and General Monitoring and Reporting Requirements."

C. Expiration Date

This Order expires on April 10, 1997.

The discharger must file a report of waste discharge in accordance with Title 23, California Code of Regulations, not later than 180 days in advance of such date as application for issuance of new waste discharge requirements.

D. Rescission

Order No. 86-30, adopted by this Board on June 23, 1986, is hereby rescinded.
