REVISION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS, PRODUCTION WELLS PUMPING TESTS PROJECT, BEVERLY HILLS, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994001, CI-7400)

Discharge of pump test water from the City of Beverly Hills production well No. 6 is currently regulated under General NPDES Permit No. 994001 (Order No. 97-045) adopted by this Regional Board on May 12, 1997.

Your consultant, RBF Consulting, submitted a letter dated August 7, 2001, requesting a revision of the General NPDES Permit to include coverage for three additional wells (Well Nos. 2, 4, and 5). The City of Beverly Hills proposes to conduct pumping tests for City Wells Nos. 2, 4, 5, and 6 and to discharge groundwater generated during the pumping tests to storm drain catch basins.

We have completed our review of your request. Based on the information provided, the proposed discharge of groundwater meets the conditions specified in Order No. 97-045, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in the Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your General NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. 97-045 and a revised Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-7400. The discharge limitations in Part E of Order No. 97-045 are applicable to your discharge. In addition, the discharge limitations in Attachment B are also applicable to your discharge..

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-7400 and NPDES No. CAG994001", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do
