COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – LAXFUEL CORP., 9900 LAXFUEL ROAD, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG914001, CI-7568)

Discharge of treated groundwater generated from groundwater cleanup of petroleum fuel pollution from the above-referenced facility is currently regulated under NPDES General Permit No. CAG834001 (Order No. 97-046) adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997.

You submitted a completed Notice of Intent (NOI) form, and analytical results of representative groundwater samples, in September 2002 and March 2003, respectively, to continue enrollment under the General NPDES Permit. We have completed our review of your application. Since chlorinated solvent type hydrocarbons and 1,4-Dioxane were present in the groundwater samples, we have determined that your discharge is more appropriately regulated under NPDES Permit No. CAG914001, Order No. R4-2002-0107, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Treated Groundwater from Investigation and/or Cleanup of Volatile Organic Compounds Contaminated-sites to Surface Waters in the Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties (General NPDES Permit No. CAG914001)*, adopted by this Board on May 23, 2002.

The existing NPDES Permit No. CAG834001 (Order No. 97-046) which was issued to you on June 30, 1997, is superseded by this new permit, and your coverage under Order No. 97-046 will be terminated in a separate letter.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your General NPDES Permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2002-0107 and revised Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-7568. The discharge limitations in Part F of Order No. R4-2002-0107 are applicable to your discharge. Discharge from the project drains to Santa Monica Bay, therefore the discharge limitations in Attachment B are not applicable to your discharge. Prior to discharge, a representative sample of the effluent shall be obtained and analyzed to determine compliance with the discharge limitations.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under Order No. R4-2002-0107. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit.
