REVISED GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS—LAXFUEL CORPORATION, 9900 LAXFUEL ROAD, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG914001, CI-7568)

In our letter dated July 27, 2007, we authorized the discharge of treated groundwater from the above-referenced facility under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit No. CAG914001, Order No. R4-2007-0022; General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges Treated Groundwater From Investigation and/or Cleanup of Volatile Organic Compounds Contaminated-Sites to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on April 5, 2007.

A few typographic errors were made in the Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-7568. Therefore, we are revising Section IV. (Effluent Monitoring Requirements) to incorporate oil & grease and total petroleum hydrocarbons as monitoring parameters. In addition, we have revised Section V.B.1. (Acute Toxicity Effluent Monitoring Program), to indicate that effluent grab sample should be used to conduct acute toxicity test.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your NPDES permit, consisting of Order R4-2007-0022, revised Fact Sheet, and Revised Monitoring & Reporting Program No. CI-7568.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit</u>. When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-7568 and NPDES No. CAG914001", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.
