WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – STELLAR BIOTECHNOLOGIES, INC., PORT HUENEME AQUACULTURE PARK, PORT HUENEME (NPDES NO. CA0064131, CI NO. 7854, ORDER NO. R4-2007-0005)

On November 3, 2007, the Regional Board issued the Tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for Stellar Biotechnologies, Inc.

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Board at a public hearing held on January 11, 2007, reviewed the tentative requirements including the change sheet, considered all factors in the case, and adopted Order No. R4-2007-0005 (copy attached) relative to this waste discharge.


This Order serves as a NPDES permit, and expires on December 10, 2011. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that an application/Report of Waste Discharge for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date.

The "Monitoring and Reporting Program" requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of this Order (March 2, 2007). Your first monitoring report for the period of January 2007 through March 2007 is due by May 1, 2007. Monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to Compliance File CI-7854 and NPDES No. CA0064131, which will assure that the reports, are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports, such as progress reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.
