COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND REVISED WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (ORDER NO. 97-045) – CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT, CALLEGUAS CONDUIT REHABILITATION PROJECT (NPDES NO. CAG994001, CI NO. 8087)

Discharge of groundwater from the Calleguas Conduit Rehabilitation Project is currently regulated under NPDES General Permit No. CAG994001 (Order No. 97-045) adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997. By a letter dated June 17, 2002, Tony Goff of your staff requested that your coverage under General NPDES Permit Order No. 97-045 be revised to include eight additional outfall locations, and to remove seven existing outfall locations within the Arroyo Simi and Sycamore Channel.

We have reviewed the information that you submitted and have revised your Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) to include eight new outfall locations as listed on Attachment 1, and to remove seven existing outfall locations. In addition, we have made other modifications to the MRP, including changing your reporting requirements from monthly to quarterly, adding annual sampling requirements for the constituents listed on Attachment B of Order No. 97-045, adding additional sample collection requirements, adding the requirement for terminating the discharge if monitoring results indicate an exceedance, adding the requirement for accelerated monitoring following the exceedance of effluent limit, and adding a requirement for reporting the exceedance to the Regional Board.

You are required to implement the revised MRP effective upon receipt. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring and technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to 'Compliance File No. CI-8087 and NPDES No. CAG994001', which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.
