TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL WASTE **DISCHARGE** REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIED DISCHARGES TO GROUNDWATER IN SANTA CLARA AND LOS ANGELES RIVER BASINS - PUBLIC SERVICES CENTER FUELING STATION, 500 W. LOS ANGELES AVENUE, SIMI VALLEY, CALIFORNIA (FILE NO. 01-116, CI-8464)

Dear Mr. Linton:

We have received a letter dated July 26, 2006, from Tetra Tech, Inc., your consultant, requesting termination of your enrollment under General Order No. R4-2002-0030 for In-Situ Groundwater Remediation at the City of Simi Valley Public Services Center Fueling Station project located at 500 W. Los Angeles Avenue, in Simi Valley, California. The project was enrolled under the General Order to evaluate potential impacts from injecting Fenton's Reagent into groundwater as part of groundwater remediation of fuel oxygenate contamination at the site. The groundwater monitoring and remediation project was performed under local regulatory oversight of the Ventura County Environmental Health Division Leaking Underground Tank Program.

The reagent injection was performed between August 8 to August 19, 2005 and groundwater monitoring pursuant to Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-8464 was completed for four quarters starting in August, 2005. Groundwater monitoring results confirm that residual effects from the injection of the reagent to groundwater were minimal and occurred within the first month following the application; that groundwater conditions returned to those that existed prior to the application within one months time; and that no residual effects of the application were observed after October, 2005. Based on these results, no further application of Fenton's Reagent is planned for the site.

Because further application of Fenton's Reagent is not planned for the site, coverage under Board General Order No. R4-2002-0030 for the facility is hereby terminated. Regulatory oversight for the groundwater monitoring and remediation project will continue under the Ventura County Environmental Health Division Leaking Underground Tank Program.
