ORDER No. R4-2009-0070

TERMINATION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, finds:

- This Regional Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR), Order No. R4-2002-0193 for the former Boeing C-1 Facility, Long Beach, California, for the discharge of a reducing agent (calcium polysulfide) to groundwater for use in in-situ chemical reduction of hexavalent chromium on December 12, 2002.
- 2. The discharge of calcium polysulfide at the site ended in 2007 and all monitoring and reporting activities associated with the WDR have been completed.
- 3. The Board finds that WDR Order No. R4-2002-0193 is no longer applicable and shall be terminated.
- 4. The termination of WDR is exempt from the provisions of Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 21100), Division 13, Public Resources Code, in accordance with Water Code Section 13389.

This Regional Board has notified the Discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to consider termination of Order No. R4-2002-0193 and has provided them with an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations. This Regional Board, in a public hearing, heard and considered all comments and testimony pertinent to the Order.

The Executive Officer of this Regional Board is authorized, and she is hereby directed, to certify and submit copies of this Order to the Discharger, and to such individuals and governmental agencies as may have need therefor, or may request same.
