TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – INTERSTATE BRANDS CORPORATION, 6841 SAN FERNANDO ROAD, GLENDALE, CALIFORNIA (ORDER NO. R4-2002-0030, CI-8661)

Dear Mr. Graves:

In our letter dated January 9, 2004, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2002-0030, Series No. 037, which specifies your Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR).

In a letter dated June 12, 2009, you notified the Regional Board that nutrients and hydrogen peroxide injection for groundwater cleanup of total petroleum hydrocarbons has not been performed and will not be performed in the future for this site. Therefore you requested termination of the WDR.

The monitoring results were provided to the Regional Board in quarterly monitoring reports. We have reviewed the data and concur with your plan to terminate the WDR. Since you are not performing the injection of nutrients and hydrogen peroxide into groundwater and no longer need the WDR, the coverage under Board Order No. R4-2002-0030, Series No. 037 for the subject facility is hereby terminated effective on June 30, 2009.


