COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – CITY OF THOUSAND OAKS, HILL CANYON WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT CONSTRUCTION PROJECT, 9600 SANTA ROSA ROAD, CAMARILLO, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994004, CI-8699)

Dear Mr. Morales:

We have completed our review of your application for a permit to discharge waste under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). You propose to conduct construction dewatering during construction for the Bioreactors at the Hill Canyon Wastewater Treatment Plant near the North Fork of the Arroyo Conejo. A maximum of 0.72 million gallons per day (MGD) of groundwater will be discharged from the dewatering project between February and October 2004.

Based on the information provided, the proposed discharge of groundwater meets the conditions specified in Order No. R4-2003-0111, *General NPDES Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Groundwater From Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your General NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2002-0111 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-8699. The discharge limitations in Part E.1.a. of Order No. R4-2003-0111 for the specific constituents listed on the table with the enclosed Fact Sheet are applicable to your discharge. The groundwater discharge flows into the North Fork of the Arroyo Conejo; therefore, the discharge limitations for boron and nitrogen listed in Attachment B.4.a. are also applicable to your discharge.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit. When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-8699 and NPDES No. CAG994004", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.
