**TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – CITY OF THOUSAND OAKS, HILL CANYON WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT CONSTRUCTION PROJECT, 9600 SANTA ROSA ROAD, CAMARILLO, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994004, CI-8699)**

In our letter dated January 29, 2004, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0111, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Groundwater From Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

We have reviewed your November 14, 2005 letter which requested termination of coverage under the General Permit. The letter indicated that you have completed your bioreactor basins construction project and have ceased discharging groundwater from the subject facility to the North Fork of the Arroyo Conejo.

On November 29, 2005, Board staff inspected the project site and verified that there is no discharge of groundwater from the site to the Arroyo. Since there is no discharge of groundwater from the subject site, coverage under Board Order No. R4-2003-0111, General NPDES Permit No. CAG994004, for the subject site is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.

Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface waters or land become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this Board and obtain waste discharge requirements.
