**TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE
REQUIREMENTS – MARK'S CHEVRON STATION, 1965 EAST ARTESIA BOULEVARD,
LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA (ORDER NO. R4-2005-0030, SERIES NO. 006, CI-8918)**

Dear Mr. Kelishadi:

In our letter dated July 12, 2005, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2005-0030, (Series No. 006), which specifies your Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR).

In a letter dated December 31, 2008, you notified the Regional Board that you ceased the re-injection of treated water for the site and that you requested termination of the WDR.

The monitoring results were provided to the Regional Board in quarterly monitoring reports. Since you have completed the in-situ remediation and no longer need the WDR, the coverage under Board Order No. R4-2005-0030, (Series No. 006), for the subject facility is hereby terminated with the exception of enforcement under the term of the permit.
