### **WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR DISCHARGE OF CONTAMINATED SOIL – JOINT WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT, CARSON, CALIFORNIA (FILE NO. 88-57-021(05))**

On December 9, 2005, the County Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (CSCLAC) filed with this Regional Board a report of waste discharge (ROWD) to dispose approximately 19,000 tons (about 15,500 cubic yards) of non-hazardous contaminated waste at the Class III Puente Hills Landfill in Whittier, California. The waste consists of near-surface soils excavated at the Joint Water Pollution Control Plant (JWPCP) in Carson, California.

We have reviewed the analytical results provided from exploratory borings in the project area that include petroleum hydrocarbons and organochlorine pesticides. The proposed discharge of this material meets the conditions specified in Order No. 91-93, "General Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharge of Non-Hazardous Contaminated Soils and Other Wastes in Los Angeles River and Santa Clara River Basins", adopted by this Regional Board on July 22, 1991 (attached).

Enclosed are Waste Discharge Requirements, comprising:

1. General Waste Discharge Requirements
2. Monitoring and Reporting Program

Please note that the Monitoring and Reporting Program requires that a report be submitted to this Regional Board within 10 days of the completion of disposal operations. ATTN: Information Technology Unit. This report shall reference the above file number.

Pursuant to Section 13267 of the California Water Code, you must submit the required final report within 10 days of the completion of disposal operations and no later than March 27, 2006. Failure to submit the required report may result in the imposition of civil liability penalties by the Regional
