NOTICE OF VIOLATION: CLEAN WATER ACT SECTION 401 WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATIONS FOR FOURTEEN CALTRANS PROJECTS – REPORTING VIOLATIONS (FILE Nos. 09-221, 09-207, 09-137, 10-035, 10-087, 10-086, 11-020, 10-054, 10-034, 11-092, 12-032, 13-143, 12-065, 12-046)

Dear Mr. Kosinski:

Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certifications for the 14 projects listed in Attachment 1 were issued by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Water Board) to the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) between January 2010 and May 2015 (Certifications).

Each of the Certifications included reporting requirements. To date, the Los Angeles Water Board has received none of the required reporting.

Without receipt of the required reports, the Los Angeles Water Board is hindered from assessing compliance with water quality laws. In particular, the Los Angeles Water Board cannot determine whether Caltrans has, in fact, implemented compensatory mitigation required by its Certifications. Ten out of 14 of the Certifications required that compensatory mitigation be completed. In total, these projects were authorized to impact 3.2787 acres (temporary and permanent impacts, exclusive of concrete to concrete repairs) and were required to complete 6.4675 acres of compensatory mitigation (6.3025 acres riparian habitat and 0.165 acres wetlands). No reports or other documentation have been received by the Los Angeles Water Board to document the implementation or success of the required compensatory mitigation.

Caltrans is in violation of the conditions and provisions of its Certifications requiring that discharges from project activities comply with the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (CWA), 33 U.S.C. section 1251 et seq., the Porter Cologne Water Quality Control Act section 13160 et seq., and the State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 2003-0017-DWQ. Pursuant to Water Code section 13385(c)(1), Caltrans is subject to administrative civil liability of up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per day for failing to comply with the reporting requirements cited above. An administrative civil liability may be assessed by the Los Angeles Water Board beginning with the date that the violations first occurred and without further warning.

The Los Angeles Water Board may also request that the Attorney General seek judicial civil liabilities or injunctive relief pursuant to Water Code section 13386.

To be in compliance with the conditions of the Certifications, Caltrans shall submit all required reporting. Reporting shall include documentation that all compensatory mitigation has been implemented. At this time, if Annual Mitigation Monitoring Reports for a specific project have not been previously prepared, in lieu of creating and submitting multiple Annual Mitigation Monitoring Reports, Caltrans may submit a single report to encompass information from all years for that project.

In addition, Caltrans must provide an explanation of how it intends to timely meet future reporting and mitigation requirements.

Compliance with the action set forth in this Notice of Violation does not affect the Regional Board's authorization to take enforcement action against Caltrans for any of the violations noted herein.
