AMENDMENT TO WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION FOR BAYSHORE SWIM DOCK REPLACEMENT (Corps' Project No. SPL-2017-00268-EDS), LOS ANGELES COUNTY (File No. 17-042)

Dear Mr. Habib:

We are in receipt of your notification on March 20, 2019, requesting an amendment of your Conditional Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification (File No. 17-042) for the subject project issued on November 14, 2017 (Certification).

Your notification on March 20, 2019 requested to change the Project Description.

In response to your request, the Certification is modified as shown below. Deleted text is shown in ~~strike-out~~ and additional text is shown underlined.

The revised project description now will read as follows.

IV. Project Description

The Project will replace an existing wooden dock with a float system supporting a translucent platform. The Project will replace access pier stringers, decking and guardrail. Renovations will include an ADA compliant ramp from existing walkway to access pier.

The project will replace existing 20' x 45' (900 sf.) wooden dock with a 1370 sf. float system. The float system will include two 450 sf. concrete floating docks supporting a 470 sf. translucent platform. The project will also:

1. Replace gangway and gangway mounting hardware;
2. Replace the access pier stringers and decking;
3. Replace guardrail;
4. Provide ADA compliant ramp from existing walkway to access pier;
5. Install bollard lighting;
6. Install four dock ladders.

The Project will use the existing "T" Piles to access the pier and will use the existing 14" diameter round piles for the float system. No pile driving will take place.

The project will also include the addition of three (3) seasonal inflatables within the existing swim line. The seasonal inflatables will add 696 sf of recreational area for the months May - October. "No-impact" helix anchors will be installed into the seafloor and remain in-place for the duration of the inflatables' lifespan. The inflatables will be attached to the helix anchors with bungees and poly-rope for the months May – October. The inflatables, bungees and poly-rope will be stored on land during the off-season.


I have determined that the above-proposed modifications do not constitute a significant change in the nature or scope of the activities described for the project in your original application. Therefore, all of the proposed modifications are hereby incorporated into 401 Certification No. 17-042 and no additional action by this agency pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water Act is necessary. This determination is limited to the proposed amendment contained in your notification to this Regional Board dated March 20, 2019 and described herein, and does not eliminate the Applicant's responsibility to comply with any other applicable laws, requirements, or permits.
