REVISED NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY

**RESOLUTION R5-2023-0061
WAIVER OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS, REPORTS OF WASTE
DISCHARGE, AND/OR WATER RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIC
TYPES OF DISCHARGE WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION
RANGER PIPELINES, INC.
HARVEST WATER CENTRAL SOUTH PIPELINES DEVELOPMENT PROJECT
SACRAMENTO COUNTY**

On 30 September 2025, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) received a Report of Waste Discharge (ROWD) from Ranger Pipelines, Inc. (hereafter referred to as Discharger), to obtain coverage under the *Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements, Reports of Waste Discharge, and/or Water Recycling Requirements for Specific Types of Discharge within the Central Valley Region* (Low Threat Waiver, Resolution R5-2023-0061) for discharge of hydrostatic testing water to a nearby farm land. The ROWD included a Form 200, project map, and a summary of the proposed site activities. Additional information and a revised Form 200 were submitted on 15 October 2025.

This Notice of Application (NOA), originally issued on 30 October 2025, has been updated to include additional discharge locations.

The submittal contains all the information required to evaluate the applicability of the discharge under the Low Threat Waiver. The discharge qualifies for the category of hydrostatic testing. Based on the information provided, the proposed discharge meets the conditions of the Waiver. The discharge is hereby covered under the Low Threat Waiver and assigned enrollee number **R5-2023-0061-0042**. Please include this number on all correspondence related to this discharge. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Harvest Water Central South Pipelines Project is part of the recycled water project led by the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District (Regional San). The Central South Pipelines Project segment consists of 15 miles of underground pipeline ranging in diameters from 12-inches to 48-inches, to be installed within the rural roadways located south of the City of Elk Grove. Installation will occur along portions of Bruceville, Twin Cities, Lambert, Ed Rau, Carroll, Point Pleasant, Hein, and Camp Roads.

Ranger Pipelines, Inc. requests authorization to discharge water generated from hydrostatic pressure testing activities associated with pipeline installation. The proposed discharge will occur on properties near the construction project boundary, including but not limited to the following sites:

Additional discharge locations may be incorporated, provided that the discharge remains on-site and a signed use agreement is secured with the respective property owner in accordance with the conditions of the Waiver. The Central Valley Water Board will be notified of such additional discharge locations.

The source water for testing will be from an existing well located on Carroll Road, as well as from other existing wells along the construction project boundary. The testing water will not be chlorinated.

Discharge will be conveyed via an existing irrigation ditch along Carroll Road, which operates as a closed system. Additional irrigation ditches located along the construction project boundary may also be utilized, provided they are operated as a closed system at the time of discharge. No discharge will occur to surface water or surface water drainage courses. Upon discharge to the ditch, the water will be immediately utilized by the landowner for agricultural purposes on-site. The total volume of water generated from testing activities is estimated to be approximately 425,000 gallons. Discharge and application activities will occur intermittently, with a completion date by 30 November 2025.

The Project is within the jurisdiction of the Central Valley Water Quality Control Board, and the operative Water Quality Control Plan is the Sacramento and San Joaquin River

Basin, Fifth Edition, revised February 2019 (hereafter Basin Plan). The Basin Plan designates beneficial uses, establishes water quality objectives, contains implementation plans and policies for protecting waters of the basin, and incorporates by reference plans and policies adopted by the State Water Board. Pursuant to §13263(a) of the California Water Code, waste discharge requirements must implement the Basin Plan.

FACILITY-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Please familiarize yourself with the contents of the Low Threat Waiver, including the Conditions of Discharge (Attachment A of the Waiver). The discharge must be managed in accordance with the requirements contained in the Conditions of Discharge and with the information submitted in the RWD and this Notice of Applicability (NOA). Ranger Pipelines, Inc. is responsible for compliance with the Waiver and must provide sufficient oversight to ensure compliance and prompt reporting of any non-compliance. Upon completion of the discharge activities and confirmation that all hydrostatic water has percolated and/or evaporated, the Discharger shall notify the Central Valley Water Board to request termination of coverage under the Waiver. Discharge of construction dewatering at a location or in a manner different from that described in the NOI or this NOA is prohibited.

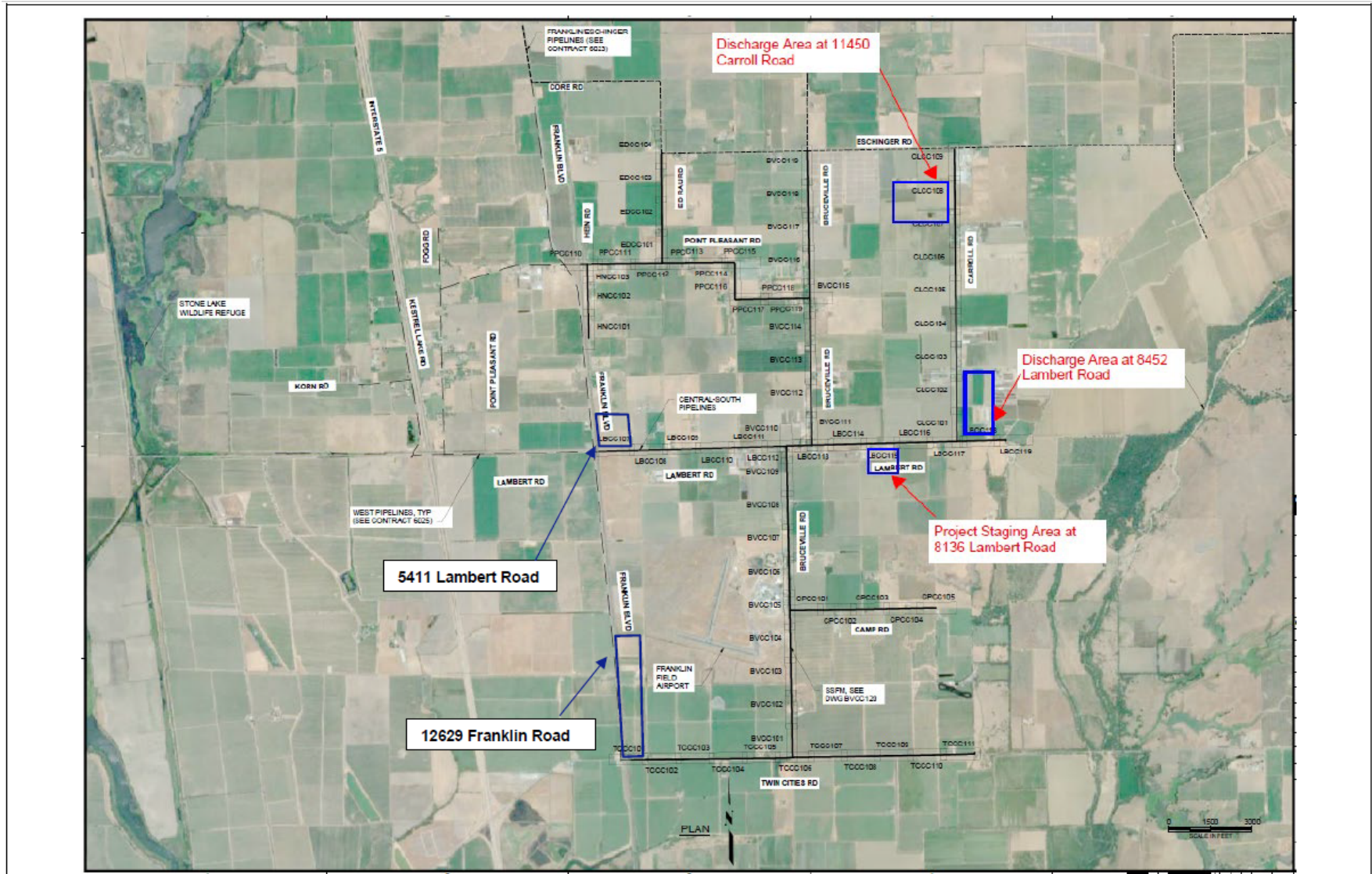
