NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY

WAIVER OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SMALL FOOD PROCESSORS, WINERIES, AND RELATED AGRICULTURAL PROCESSORS WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION

ORDER R5-2015-0005-0096 3 OAKS VINEYARD, FRESNO COUNTY

On 5 February 2015, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) adopted the *Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Food Processors, Wineries, and Related Agricultural Processors within the Central Valley Region, Order R5-2015-0005* (the Waiver).

We are in receipt of your Report of Waste Discharge (RWD) and Notice of Intent (NOI) dated 15 August 2018, which states that you intend to comply with the Tier 1 conditions of the Waiver. Tier 1 allows land application of up to 10,000 gallons of wastewater per year for irrigation of landscaping or crops and land application of residual solids associated with that volume of wastewater. Any process wastewater or residual solids in excess of those amounts must be disposed of off-site at an appropriately permitted facility. If you wish to land apply more wastewater or residual solids, you must submit a new application to obtain coverage under Tiers 2 or 3 of the Waiver or obtain individual waste discharge requirements prior to increasing the discharge volume.

Based on the information provided in the RWD, we have determined that the discharge meets the required conditions for approval under the Waiver. You are hereby assigned Order R5-2015-0005-0096. A copy of the Waiver is enclosed and available at:

Please familiarize yourself with the contents of the Waiver, including the Conditions of Discharge (Waiver Attachment A) and Monitoring and Reporting Program (Waiver Attachment B). The discharge must be managed in accordance with the requirements contained in the Conditions of Discharge and with the information submitted in the RWD.

Steven T. Shoemaker 3 Oaks Vineyard, Inc. Boutique Winery

DISCHARGE DESCRIPTION

3 Oaks Vineyard, Inc., is a boutique Winery owned and operated by Steven and Vicki Shoemaker (Discharger) at 8807 North Sunnyside Avenue in Fresno County. According to the RWD, the Winery will crush approximately 7,000 pounds (3.5 tons) of grapes from an approximately 1-acre vineyard, and will generate up to 400 to 500 gallons of winery process wash water (wastewater) annually.

According to Mr. Shoemaker, all wine making operations and maintenance activities take place indoors on a concrete surface. Any residual wastewater remaining on the floor is cleaned to prevent runoff. Provided the Discharger conducts all wine making operations indoors and all industrial equipment and chemicals are stored indoors, the Discharger is not required to apply for coverage under the NPDES General Industrial Storm Water permit (NPDES No. CAS000001) at this time.

Wastewater will be limited to water used for cleaning and rinsing the wine tanks, presses, and grape storage containers. The wastewater will be manually discharged to a small grassy area (about 1,000 square feet) adjacent the wine making barn. Residual solids will be distributed as a soil amendment and incorporated into the soil within the onsite vineyard.

The Discharger reports using small amounts (three to four gallons annually) of cleaners including meta-bisulfite and citric acid to clean out stainless steel and plastic fermentation barrels. The cleaning chemicals are stored indoors in the wine making building.

MONITORING AND REPORTING

Attachment B of the Waiver includes specific monitoring and reporting requirements that you must comply with, including routine monitoring and reporting to the Central Valley Water Board. Please review the Monitoring and Reporting Program closely and establish the appropriate record keeping system so that you are able to complete the required Annual Monitoring Report form, which is also contained in Attachment B of the Waiver. By **February 1 of each year**, the Annual Monitoring Report must be submitted to our office, even if there is no discharge during the reporting year. The 2018 Annual Monitoring Report is due by **1 February 2019**

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

The Waiver includes specific and general conditions with which you must comply with. You must maintain control over the discharge and operate in accordance with the information provided in your RWD and this Notice of Applicability.

Please review this Notice of Applicability carefully to ensure that it completely and accurately reflects the facility name, location, and details of the proposed discharge. Failure to comply with the requirements of the Waiver may result in enforcement action as authorized by provisions of the California Water Code, which could include civil liability. Discharge of wastes not described in the Conditions of Discharge (Attachment A) of the Waiver is prohibited.

Please note that the Waiver will expire on **5 February 2020**, after which you must do one of the following:

- 1. Submit a new RWD with a filing fee (if required) to obtain coverage under a subsequently adopted waiver,
- 2. Submit a RWD with a filing fee to apply for individual or general Waste Discharge Requirements, or
- 3. Cease the discharge.
