Response to Written Comments for
Tentative Waste Discharge Requirements
for
County of Tulare
Woodlake Landfill, Tulare County

This document contains the responses to written comments received from interested parties regarding the proposed tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for the County of Tulare, Woodlake Landfill, Tulare County for postclosure maintenance. Tentative WDRs R5-201X-XXXX were prepared to update postclosure maintenance requirements for the facility and incorporated Monitoring and Reporting Program R5-201X-XXXX (MRP). Currently, the facility is regulated under WDRs 5-01-199.

The Tentative WDRs were circulated on 21 September 2017 for public comment, ending on 23 October 2017. A total of one letter/email was received and these comments are addressed below.

RESPONSE TO COMMENTS

Comment A.1:

Finding No. 4 lists the documents that are attached to the Tentative Order and incorporated into and made part of the Order however the list of documents does not include the tentative Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP). Please add the MRP to the list in this finding.

Response A.1:

The recommended revision has been made.

Comment A.2:

MRP, B. Reporting, B.1. Reporting Schedule: Page 4 of the MRP reporting schedule indicates that Semiannual reporting for the periods ending 30 June and 31 December are due 1 August and 1 February respectively. Please change the due dates to 31 August and 28 February so as to be consistent with other Tulare County MRPs. Also, please change the dates where they repeat on page 6 of the MRP.

Response A.2:

The recommended revision has been made.

Comment A.3:

MRP, B. Reporting, B.2. Reporting Schedule: Page 5 of the MRP reporting schedule indicates that Annual Monitoring Report is due 1 February. Please change the due date to 28 February so as to be consistent with other Tulare County MRPs. Also, please change the date where it repeats on page 7 of the MRP.

Response A.3:

The recommended revision has been made.

Comment A.4:

MRP, Table I: In the list of Monitoring Parameters, Diesel Range Organics are required as USEPA Method 8015M. This is not a requirement for the current MRP nor is it a requirement contained in any other Tulare County landfill MRPs. In addition, the tentative MRP does not have a corresponding table containing a list of required constituents for this method.

Please confirm whether or not this will be a new requirement of the Monitoring Parameters at Woodlake Landfill and, if so, ass a list of constituents for this method to the MRP.

Response A.4:

Diesel Range Organics were inadvertently added to the MRP and are not part of the Monitoring Parameters for this site. As such, this requirement has been removed from the MRP.
