NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING concerning

Modification of Waste Discharge Requirements for

GLENN SPRINGS HOLDING COMPANY FORMER OCCIDENTAL CHEMICAL COMPANY GROUNDWATER EXTRACTION AND TREARTMENT SYSTEMS PERMIT REVISION LATHROP FACILITY SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

Occidental Chemical Company (OCC) retains the liability for implementing remedial actions at the Former Best Fertilizer Company (Site). OCC is managing remediation activities through Glenn Springs Holdings, Inc. (GSHI). OCC and GSHI currently discharges treated groundwater from its Groundwater Extraction and Treatment System (GETS) into three deep injection wells that are completed below the Corcoran Clay, located approximately 270 to 305 feet below ground surface (bgs). Contaminants of concern (COCs) associated with OCC's past operations at the Site include the pesticides1,2-dibromo-3-chloropropane (DBCP) and ethylene dibromide (EDB), as well as the solvent 2,3,4,5-tetrahydrothiophene-1,1-dioxide, commonly known as sulfolane, which was used for cleaning process equipment at the Site. 1,2-3-trichloropropane (TCP), which is typically associated with facilities involved in DBCP production, has also been detected in groundwater beneath the Site. Groundwater beneath the Site and its vicinity is also contaminated with sulfate, nitrate, chloride, lindane, and isomers of benzene hexachloride (BHC).

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board) will consider several modifications of the previous Waste Discharge Requirements. The main modifications include:

- updated discharge specifications of the treated groundwater
- updated sulfolane effluent limits
- incorporating effluent limits for total dissolved solids and nitrate
- increased injection limit of treated groundwater below the Corcoran Clay
- updated compliance monitoring, and GETS monitoring requirements

These changes will allow OCC and GSHI to extract additional water to control the contaminant plumes they are required to cleanup.

All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **2 December 2020**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

The Tentative Permit was issued for a 30-day public comment period on **2 November 2020** and comments are due by **5:00 p.m.** on **2 December 2020**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m.** on **2 December 2020** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any person requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
