NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING concerning

TENTATIVE RESCISSION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
FOLSOM CORPORATION YARD FORMER LANDFILL
SACRAMENTO COUNTY

A Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) is tentatively being considered for the City of Folsom as the operator and landowner, also known as the discharger (Discharger) for the Folsom Corporation Yard Former Landfill (Facility) located at the Folsom Corporation Yard at 1300 Leidesdorff Street, Folsom, California 95630, which is near Lake Natoma in the City of Folsom in Sacramento County. The Folsom Corporation Yard is near the site of historic Black Miner's Bar townsite, a former gold rush era boomtown.

The Folsom Corporation Yard is an 18-acre property which was the site of a former 3.2-acre unlined landfill and adjacent 1.1-acre "Uncontrolled Fill Area." From approximately 1951 to 1973 and prior to construction of the landfill, the City of Folsom Sewage Treatment Plant occupied the area. The Discharger operated the 3.2-acre landfill from 1974 until 1987, accepting street cleaning and other wastes from City of Folsom owned and/or operated facilities, and closed the landfill in 1996. The Discharger installed the landfill within the berms of the former Folsom Sewage Treatment Plant wastewater ponds.

In 2008/2009, the Discharger clean closed the landfill and "Uncontrolled Fill Area" by excavating and removing approximately 100,000 cubic yards of material, including the landfill cap, fill, former wastewater lagoon liner, and any contaminated underlying soils. The Discharger backfilled excavated materials with clean soil and covered with asphalt and clean aggregate to the 2010 satisfaction of the Executive Officer and the Department of Toxic Substances Control and CalRecycle. In 2021 the Discharger demonstrated via post-closure groundwater monitoring, that groundwater quality beneath the Facility returned to compliance with the Water Quality Protection Standard and the former landfill and "Uncontrolled Fill Area" no longer threaten water quality.

The Rescission of WDRs Order would recognize successful completion of clean closure of the former landfill, thereby eliminating the need for any further post-closure maintenance or monitoring and removes the former landfill from being subject to the State Water Board promulgated requirements of Title 27 (Title 27, Section 20950(2)(B)).

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **21 March 2023**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

The Tentative Rescission Order was issued for a 30-day public comment period on 17 February 2023 and comments are due by 5:00 p.m. on 21 March 2023. Written evidence or comments submitted after 5:00 p.m. on 21 March 2023 will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any person requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good

cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
