TENTATIVE ORDER WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER R5 2023-XXXX NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT CA0078051 FOR CITY OF MT. SHASTA AND U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, FOREST SERVICE CITY OF MT. SHASTA WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT SISKIYOU COUNTY

Discharger and Tentative Order Information

The City of Mt. Shasta (Discharger) is the owner and operator of the City of Mt. Shasta Wastewater Treatment Plant (Facility), located at 2500 Grant Road, Mt. Shasta, CA. The Facility provides sewerage services for the City of Mt Shasta, serving a population of approximately 3,223. The Facility provides treatment for an average dry weather flow of 0.8 million gallons per day of domestic wastewater. The Facility discharges treated wastewater to the Sacramento River, a water of the United States. The Facility's existing discharge points are located at the Sacramento River, a leachfield on property owned by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, and as recycled water used by the Mt. Shasta Resort Golf Course.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2017-0117, adopted by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 08 December 2017. An Order is proposed to renew the NPDES permit.

The tentative Order proposes effluent limitations and other requirements to implement the *State Policy for Water Quality Control: Toxicity Provisions* (as amended Oct. 5, 2021) ("Toxicity Provisions"). The Toxicity Provisions will take effect upon approval by U.S. EPA. If U.S. EPA does not approve the Toxicity Provisions before the public hearing, Central Valley Water Board staff will propose revisions to the tentative Order to remove these requirements and include monitoring requirements, and, as appropriate, effluent or receiving water limitations for chronic and acute toxicity based on the Basin Plan's narrative toxicity objective and the *Policy for Implementation of Toxics Standards for Inland Surface Waters, Enclosed Bays, and Estuaries of California* (2005).

Nature and Purpose of Hearing

At the hearing, the Central Valley Water Board will hear testimony and oral comments regarding the tentative Order. This proceeding will be a formal adjudicatory proceeding. The <u>procedures governing Central Valley Water Board adjudicatory hearings</u> (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/laws_regulations/) may be found at California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648 et seq. and are available upon request.

Prehearing Submission of Written Comments and Evidence

The **Discharger** is a party to this proceeding. As a party, the Discharger must submit written evidence or comments, if any, for the Board to consider no later than 5:00 p.m. on **8 March 2023** to the Central Valley Water Board email at <u>RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov</u>.

Interested persons include any non-party that is interested in the outcome of the hearing. Interested persons wishing to comment, in writing, on the tentative Order shall submit comments no later than 5:00 p.m. on **8 March 2023** to the Central Valley Water Board email at <u>RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov</u>.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648.4, the Board Chair may refuse to admit written evidence or comments that are not submitted in accordance with this Notice and shall refuse to do so when there is a showing of prejudice to the Discharger or the Board. Excluded material will not be considered by the Board.

Persons who wish to participate in the hearing as a party must submit a request in writing no later than 5:00 p.m. on **16 February 2023** to the Central Valley Water Board email at <u>RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov</u>. The request must include facts demonstrating how the person will be substantially affected by the proceeding.

The Board Chair will not designate a person as a party if the Board Chair determines the designation will impair the interests of justice and the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceeding. The Board Chair, when granting a request for party status, may impose restrictions on the requestor's hearing participation, including limiting or excluding the use of cross-examination and other procedures to promote the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceeding.

Visual Presentations

Hearing participants may use PowerPoint or other visual presentations at the hearing, but the presentation content shall not exceed the scope of previously submitted written material. Presentations, if any, must be provided to the below Central Valley Water Board Contact by 12:00 p.m. on **24 April 2023.**

Hearing Procedure and Time Limits

The hearing on the tentative Order will be conducted in the general order listed under California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648.5, except that the Board Chair may modify the order for good cause.

The **Discharger** will be advised in advance of the hearing of the total amount of time allocated for its presentation and closing statement. The Discharger is invited to contact staff in advance of the hearing to discuss how much time it believes is necessary.

Interested persons may speak at the hearing and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals, if any. Each interested person will have 3 minutes to present oral comments. Additional time may be provided, upon request, at the discretion of the Board Chair.

Hearing Accommodations

The hearing facilities will be accessible to persons with disabilities.
