
SeaWorld San Diego is pleased to express its support for the proposed Tentative Order modifying the SeaWorld NPDES Permit.

SeaWorld is deeply appreciative of your staff's recommendation to modify the fecal and total coliform evaluation period in the Permit to a monthly calendar period. As noted in the Tentative Order, this modification will not cause or contribute to any exceedance of the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Diego Basin. And, SeaWorld must continue to maintain compliance with the bacterial objectives in the receiving water.

SeaWorld supports the Tentative Order because it ensures that the entire Permit is internally consistent with all effluent limitations, corrects a technical error and eliminates the possibility of being penalized multiple times for only one coliform effluent limitation exceedance in the event of an enforcement action.

SeaWorld requested this modification in a letter dated February 4, 2013, to align overall permit consistency and clarify technical interpretations. It is important to note that SeaWorld did not request changes to the effluent limitations in its Permit.

The amendment will not impact water quality in Mission Bay and is consistent with the San Diego Regional Basin Plan which states that, "All waters shall be maintained free of toxic substances in concentrations that are toxic, or that produce detrimental physiological responses in human, plant, animal, or aquatic life".
