Waste Discharge Requirements for Continental Maritime of San Diego Discharge to San Diego Bay

The following changes have been made to Tentative Order No. R9-2015-0009 based on the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency letter dated February 11, 2015, included in the agenda package as Supporting Document No. 6. Changes to the Tentative Order listed below are shown in bold and underline/strikeout format to indicate added and removed language, respectively.

1. On page E-5, Section III.C.2 shall be modified as:

2. Marine and Estuarine Species and Test Methods

The Discharger shall conduct a species sensitivity screening for chronic toxicity on a representative sample which shall include one vertebrate, one invertebrate, and one aquatic plant during the first required monitoring period. The species sensitivity screening samples shall also be analyzed for the parameters required for the discharge. The test species that exhibits the highest percent effect at the Instream Waste Concentration (IWC) during a species sensitivity screening (i.e. the most sensitive species) shall be utilized for routine monitoring during the permit cycle. Routine toxicity test design shall, at a minimum, include a single-concentration analysis of the IWC compared to a control.
