The project proposes to remove about 35 cubic yards of sediment, mud and debris for approximately 10-feet upstream and downstream of existing culvert crossed by SR-76. The proposed project also includes the upstream construction of a concrete pad with an area of gravel backfill. A maintenance vehicle pullout would also be constructed with an access ramp leading down to the concrete pad.

#### STANDARD CONDITIONS:

The following three standard conditions apply to <u>all</u> certification actions, except as noted under Condition 3 for denials (Action 3).

- 1. This certification action is subject to modification or revocation upon administrative or judicial review, including review and amendment pursuant to section 13330 of the California Water Code and section 3867 of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations (23 CCR).
- 2. This certification action is not intended and must not be construed to apply to any discharge from any activity involving a hydroelectric facility requiring a Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) license or an amendment to a FERC license unless the pertinent certification application was filed pursuant to 23 CCR subsection 3855(b) and the application specifically identified that a FERC license or amendment to a FERC license for a hydroelectric facility was being sought.
- 3. The validity of any non-denial certification action (Actions 1 and 2) must be conditioned upon total payment of the full fee required under 23 CCR section 3833, unless otherwise stated in writing by the certifying agency.

#### ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS:

In addition to the three standard conditions, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) must satisfy the following:

### A. GENERAL CONDITIONS:

- 1. Caltrans must, at all times, fully comply with the engineering plans, specifications and technical reports submitted to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (Regional Board), to support this 401 Water Quality Certification and all subsequent submittals required as part of this certification and as described in Attachment 1. The conditions within this certification must supersede any conflicting provisions within such plans submitted prior to the certification action.
- 2. During construction, Caltrans must maintain a copy of this certification at the project site so as to be available at all times to site personnel and agencies.
- 3. Caltrans must permit the Regional Board or its authorized representative at all times, upon presentation of credentials:
  - a. Entry onto project premises, including all areas on which wetland fill or wetland mitigation is located or in which records are kept.
  - b. Access to copy any records required to be kept under the terms and conditions of this certification.
  - c. Inspection of any treatment equipment, monitoring equipment, or monitoring method required by this certification.
  - d. Sampling of any discharge or surface water covered by this Order.

- 4. Caltrans must notify the Regional Board within 24 hours of any unauthorized discharge, including hazardous or toxic materials, to waters of the U.S. and/or State; measures that were implemented to stop and contain the discharge; measures implemented to clean-up the discharge; the volume and type of materials discharged and recovered; and additional best management practice (BMPs) or other measures that will be implemented to prevent future discharges.
- 5. Caltrans must, at all times, maintain appropriate types and sufficient quantities of materials onsite to contain any spill or inadvertent release of materials that may cause a condition of pollution or nuisance if the materials reach waters of the U.S. and/or State.
- 6. In the event of any violation or threatened violation of the conditions of this certification, the violation or threatened violation must be subject to any remedies, penalties, process or sanctions as provided for under State law. For purposes of section 401(d) of the Clean Water Act, the applicability of any State law authorizing remedies, penalties, process or sanctions for the violation or threatened violation constitutes a limitation necessary to assure compliance with the water quality standards and other pertinent requirements incorporated into this certification.
- 7. In response to a suspected violation of any condition of this certification, the Regional Board may require the holder of any permit or license subject to this certification to furnish, under penalty of perjury, any technical or monitoring reports the Regional Board deems appropriate, provided that the burden, including costs, of the reports must bear a reasonable relationship to the need for the reports and the benefits to be obtained from the reports.
- 8. In response to any violation, or anticipated violation of the conditions of this certification, the Regional Board may add to or modify the conditions of this certification as appropriate to ensure compliance.

#### **B. PROJECT CONDITIONS:**

- 1. Prior to the start of the project Caltrans must educate all personnel on the requirements in this certification, pollution prevention measures, spill response, and BMP implementation and maintenance.
- 2. Caltrans must notify the Regional Board in writing at least 5 days prior to the actual commencement of dredge, fill, and discharge activities.
- 3. Caltrans must comply with the requirements of State Water Resources Control Board Water Quality Order No. 99-06-DWQ, NPDES No. CAS000003, the NPDES Permit for Statewide Storm Water Permit and Waste

- Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for the State of California, Department of Transportation (Caltrans), July 1999.
- 4. Discharges of concentrated flow during construction or after completion must not cause downstream erosion or damage to properties or stream habitat.
- 5. Water containing mud, silt, or other pollutants from equipment washing or other activities, must not be discharged to waters of the United States and/or the State or placed in locations that may be subjected to storm flows.
- 6. All surface waters, including ponded waters, must be diverted away from areas undergoing grading, construction, excavation, vegetation removal, and/or any other activity which may result in a discharge to the receiving water. Diversion activities must not result in the degradation of beneficial uses or exceedance of water quality objectives of the receiving waters. Any temporary dam or other artificial obstruction constructed must only be built from materials such as clean gravel which will cause little or no siltation. Normal flows must be restored to the affected stream immediately upon completion of work at that location.
- 7. Substances hazardous to aquatic life including, but not limited to, petroleum products, raw cement/concrete, asphalt, and coating materials, must be prevented from contaminating the soil and/or entering waters of the United States and/or State. BMPs must be implemented to prevent such discharges during each project activity involving hazardous materials.

#### C. STREAM PHOTO DOCUMENTATION PROCEDURE:

1. Caltrans must conduct photo documentation of the project site, including all areas of permanent and temporary impact, prior to and after project construction, and mitigation areas, including all areas of permanent and temporary impact, prior to and after project construction. Photodocumentation will be submitted to the Regional Board with the report as required by Condition E.3 of this certification.

#### D. COMPENSATORY MITIGATION FOR LOSS OF WATERS OF THE U.S./STATE:

- 1. Mitigation for permanent discharges to 0.007 acres of jurisdictional unvegetated streambed has been achieved at a ratio of 1:1. Permanent impacts to 0.003 acres of jurisdictional freshwater marsh have been mitigated at a ratio of 3:1. Mitigation has been achieved by deducting an excess of 0.017 acres of wetland creation credits from the Caltrans Marron Mitigation site, adjacent to the SR-76.
- 2. Mitigation for temporary impacts to 0.10 acre of jurisdictional freshwater marsh and 0.03 acres of CDF&G southern willow scrub have been mitigated

- at a ratio of 1:1 by deducting an excess of 0.04 acres of wetland creation credits from the Caltrans Marron Mitigation site, adjacent to the SR-76.
- 3. Caltrans must additionally restore all areas of temporary impacts to waters of the United States/State and all other areas of temporary disturbance which could result in a discharge or a threatened discharge to waters of the State. Restoration must include grading of disturbed areas to pre-project contours and revegetation with native species. Areas temporarily impacted will be restored within a year of impacts.

#### E. REPORTING:

- 1. All information requested in this Certification is pursuant to California Water Code (CWC) section 13267. Civil liability may be administratively imposed by the Regional Board for failure to furnish requested information pursuant to CWC section 13268.
- 2. All reports and information submitted to the Regional Board must be submitted in both hardcopy and electronic format, with a cover referencing the subject project and certification number.
- 3. Caltrans must submit a report to the Regional Board within 30 days of completion of the project. The report should include as-built drawings no bigger than 11" x 17" and photos of the completed project.

### F. SIGNATORY REQUIREMENT

- 1. All applications, reports, or information submitted to the Regional Board must be signed as follows:
  - a) For a corporation, by a responsible corporate officer of at least the level of vice president.
  - b) For a partnership or sole proprietorship, by a general partner or proprietor, respectively.
  - c) For a municipality, or a state, federal, or other public agency, by either a principal executive officer or ranking elected official.

- 2. A duly authorized representative of a person designated in Items 1.a. through 1.c. above may sign documents if:
  - a) The authorization is made in writing by a person described in Items 1.a. through 1.c. above.
  - b) The authorization specifies either an individual or position having responsibility for the overall operation of the regulated activity.
  - c) The written authorization is submitted to the Regional Board Executive Officer.
- 3. All applications, reports, or information submitted to the Regional Board Executive Officer must be certified as follows:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted in this document and all attachments and that, based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the information is true, accurate, and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment."

#### WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION:

I hereby certify that the proposed discharge from SR-76 Monserate Hill Road Project (Certification No. 08C-012) will comply with the applicable provisions of sections 301 ("Effluent Limitations"), 302 ("Water Quality Related Effluent Limitations"), 303 ("Water Quality Standards and Implementation Plans"), 306 ("National Standards of Performance"), and 307 ("Toxic and Pretreatment Effluent Standards") of the Clean Water Act. 



# ATTACHMENT 3 LOCATION MAP




California Department of Transportation 11-SD-76, PM 15.5, Monserate Hill LOCATION MAP




