Subject: Amendment to Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification No. 10C-010 for the San Onofre Culvert and Slope Repair Project

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) is amending the San Onofre Culvert and Slope Repair Project, Certification number 10C-010. This amendment to the Water Quality Certification has been requested by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), District 11.

Changes/additions/deletions to section B (Project Conditions) of 401 Water Quality Certification 10C-010 are shown in bold strikeout/underline below:

10. All No construction activity within waters of the U.S. and/ or State shall must occur while water is flowing through the work area during the dry season (May 1—September 30).

Any petition for reconsideration of this Certification amendment must be filed with the State Water Resources Control Board within 30 days of certification action (23 CCR § 3867). If no petition is received, it will be assumed that Caltrans District 11 has accepted and will comply with all conditions of the Certification. Failure to comply with all conditions of this Certification may result in enforcement actions against Caltrans District 11.



Project Location - City: City of Del Mar Project Location - County: San Diego County

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: The project proposes to protect two petroleum pipelines that are exposed due to erosion in Gonzalez Canyon. Pipe LS 122 will be cut and capped at the banks of the ephemeral wash, and Pipe LS 126 will be covered with a grout filled geotextile mattress, secured to the bed and banks of the channel. An area approximately 35-feet wide by 35-feet long will be disturbed within, and adjacent to the channel (permanent impacts will total 0.009 acre of streambed and temporary impacts will no more than 0.003 acre). Access to the site will come from existing utility access roads. The pipeline right-of-way will be used for temporary stockpile of soil. Work will occur when there is no water flowing in the channel and when no rain is forecasted for 48 hours. Work will avoid the breeding season. All temporary impacts will be restored to pre-project conditions. An additional 0.12 acre of coastal sage scrub mitigation credits will be purchased from an established mitigation bank with an MHPA or through the deposition of money into the City of San Diego Habitat Acquisition Fund.
