



Racial equity occurs when race can no longer be used to predict life outcomes and when outcomes for all groups are improved.






### FY 2021-22 Available Funds for the SAFER Program



### **How New Funding Affects SAFER**

- COVID-19 related debt and revenue gaps: \$985 million
- Drinking Water Construction:
  - \$650 million for drinking water infrastructure in DACs
  - At least \$1.1 billion for capital projects
  - \$35 million in FEP for construction
- Drinking Water Drought Emergencies
  - \$10 million from general fund
  - \$32 million from existing programs
  - \$39.3 million in FEP for interim water supplies and emergencies

### **Proposed FY 2021-22 Targets**

Focus on small DACs and low-income households.

- TA funds focus on completing planning tasks that accelerate projects towards construction and are intended to help address the large number of at-risk systems.
- Planning, construction, direct O&M, and construction funds will prioritize consolidation efforts via incentives.

• Assistance for **state smalls and domestic wells** at high risk of groundwater contamination or drought impacts.






