### PURPOSE

The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) invites you to attend a workshop to learn about the Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) drinking water program and the opportunities available to California Native American Tribes. Using short- and long-term strategies, SAFER is designed to ensure Californians who lack safe, adequate, and affordable drinking water receive it as quickly as possible, and that the water systems serving them establish sustainable solutions. The agenda and purpose of these workshops are:

1. State Water Board and Department of Water Resources staff provide information on the drinking water opportunities available to California Native American Tribes, with a focus on the State Water Board's SAFER drinking water program, including the draft Fund Expenditure Plan and funding opportunities.
2. Participants discuss and ask questions about the programs and funding opportunities
3. Facilitated discussion on the of inclusion of Tribal drinking water data in statewide water system needs assessments.

The workshops will be co-hosted by the Department of Water Resources, which will present the same agenda and information on three separate dates, based on geographic regions of California. Participation is open to everyone and is *not* dependent upon living or working in a particular geographic region. Prior event registration is not required.

## **BACKGROUND**

This meeting is part of the State Water Board's Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) program. The SAFER program was designed to ensure Californians who lack safe and affordable drinking water receive it as quickly as possible. The SAFER program is helping water systems achieve this goal through a set of tools, funding sources, regulatory authorities, and community outreach and education.

Tribal water systems are regulated by the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Though the Water Boards do not oversee tribal water systems, the Water Boards are committed to working with California Native American Tribes to maximize the likelihood that the Tribes can benefit from the SAFER program.
