The IEA has been a proud supporter of the Carlsbad Desalination Project since 2000 and I have testified before you on several occasions. We recognize that a dependable and affordable water supply is critical to the well-being of San Diego's industrial community, which employs thousands of San Diegans and contributes greatly to the regional economy.

We understand that the Regional Water Quality Control Board is currently reviewing the marine life mitigation plan for the Carlsbad Desalination Project as a condition to the Flow, Entrainment and Impingement Minimization Plan that the board conditionally approved in April, 2008. Per the Board's direction, this plan has already been scrutinized by a multitude of regulatory and permitting state agencies, and the plan was overwhelmingly approved by the CA Coastal Commission and the State Lands Commission.
