EXECUTIVE OFFICER SUMMARY REPORT
October 11, 2017

- ITEM: 7
- SUBJECT: WDR Rescission: Rescission of Order No. 95-104 (H.G. Fenton Material Company, Carroll Canyon Plant), San Diego County (Tentative Order No. R9-2017-0104) (*Brandon Bushnell and Fisayo Osibodu*)
- PURPOSE: To consider adopting Tentative Order No. R9-2017-0104 (Supporting Document No. 1).
- RECOMMENDATION: Adoption of Tentative Order No. R9-2017-0104 (Tentative Order).
- KEY ISSUES: Lehigh Hanson¹ has terminated its sand and gravel mining and ready mix operations at its Carroll Canyon Plant. As a result waste discharge requirements are no longer required.
- PRACTICAL VISION: Rescission of waste discharge requirements for facilities no longer in operation keeps our Orders current and is consistent with the San Diego Water Board's values of communication and transparency espoused in the Practical Vision.
- DISCUSSION: Order No. 95-104, *Waste Discharge Requirements for H. G. Fenton Material Company, Carrol Canyon Plant, San Diego County*, established requirements for the discharge of wash water to onsite settling ponds from sand and gravel processing, truck washing, and concrete batching operations at the Carroll Canyon Plant (plant). The location of the plant is shown in Supporting Document No. 2.
- Lehigh Hanson notified the San Diego Water Board via letter dated January 6, 2017 that it had terminated operations at the plant (Supporting Document No. 3). San Diego Water Board staff inspected the plant on March 28, 2017 and verified that no wash water was being discharged and that the operations referenced above had been terminated.

No comments were received from the public on the Tentative Order during the written comment period.
