MINUTES OF MEETING JULY 14, 2010

At 9:00 a.m. Chairman King called to order the meeting of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) at the Regional Water Quality Control Board, 9174 Sky Park Court, San Diego, California.

Item 2 – Public Forum

Kris McFadden, Deputy Director for the City of San Diego Storm Water Department, addressed the Board regarding the Stormwater System Master Maintenance Permit being proposed by the City. He welcomed the Board's questions and input.

Item 2 to continue after 11:00 a.m.

<u>Item 4</u> – Chairman's, Board Members', State Water Board liaison's and Executive Officer's Reports: These items are for Board discussion only. No public testimony will be allowed, and the Board will take no formal action.

Mr. David Gibson discussed the Basin Plan and recommended an update which could take 2 to 4 years to complete. He also discussed holding workshops (beginning August 5th), inviting staff and other parties.

Mr. Gibson also commented on item 6 in his report.

Board Member Luker arrived at this time.

Chairman King asked Mr. Gibson about the state budget. Mr. Gibson reported on budget changes and the anticipation of being paid minimum wage.

<u>Item 9a</u> – Prehearing Conference to Consider San Diego Water Board Cleanup Team Motion to Extend Discovery Schedule. The San Diego Water Board will consider ruling on the San Diego Water Board Cleanup Team Motion to Extend the Discovery Schedule in Tentative Cleanup and Abatement Order No. R9-2010-0002, San Diego Bay Shipyard Sediment Site. Responses to the Motion were due on or before June 24, 2010. *(Frank Melbourn)*

Chairman King addressed the public, staff, and Board.

Mr. Anderson and Mr. Loveland arrived at this time.

Chairman King (the Presiding Officer for this item) explained the hearing procedures.

Senior staff member Julie Chan gave the presentation.

Mr. Gibson asked the Board to consider the motion to extend the deadline for cleanup and liability issues for 120 days. He said there were more cleanups to be done throughout San Diego (San Diego Bay).

Mr. David Boyers, attorney for the State Water Board's Enforcement Office summarized a written memo, discussing cease and desist orders. He said, in that case, the cleanup process was different and significant negative environmental impacts could occur. Mr. Boyers suggested that the EIR process begin early.

Ms. Chan commented on the Cleanup and Abatement Order.

Mr. Gibson gave a report for the Cleanup Team.

Presiding Officer King asked questions of Mr. Boyers and Mr. Gibson.

Presiding Officer King made comments and asked questions of staff and the copermittees.

After considering the Motion, responses to the Motion, and comments from the Designated Parties, Presiding Officer King denied the Motion. The Motion also included an alternative request for reconsideration by the full Board. All other Board Members present during the prehearing conference expressed support for the ruling, and therefore declined to overrule Presiding Officer King's ruling to deny the Motion. Therefore, according to the Final Discovery Plan, the discovery period would end August 23, 2010. However, the Designated Parties would have until July 19, 2010 to disclose their expert and non-expert witnesses.

In addition, Presiding Officer King directed Mr. Gibson to immediately submit a request to the State Board for an emergency sole source allocation to authorize the hiring of a consultant to complete an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for

the cleanup project in the event the Designated Parties failed to timely agree to a cost sharing arrangement to fully compensate the consultant.

Finally, Presiding Officer King terminated the Board sanctioned mediation.

Jill Witkowski, with San Diego Coastkeeper, spoke regarding the City of San Diego's Master Stormwater Maintenance program and urged the Board to solicit public comments on the program before it came to the Board for approval.
