A motion was made by Mr. Loveland and seconded by Mr. Anderson to adopt the minutes. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously, with Dr. Abarbanel and Mr. Morales abstaining.

<u>Item 4</u> – Chairman's, Board Members', State Water Board liaison's and Executive Officer's Reports: These items are for Board discussion only. No public testimony will be allowed, and the Board will take no formal action.

Frances Spivy-Weber reported on the budget and upcoming meetings in Sacramento that the Board Members might be interested in attending.

Mr. Gibson briefly discussed the Executive Officer's Report. There was no Board discussion.

<u>Item 5</u> – Master Reclamation Permit Revision: City of San Clemente Water Reclamation Plant, Modifications to Order No. R9-2003-0123 (Tentative Order No. R9-2012-0026) (*Fisayo Osibodu*).

A motion was made by George Loveland and seconded by Eric Anderson to adopt this Order with Errata. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

<u>Item 6</u> – NPDES Permit Amendment: Encina Wastewater Authority, Approval of Local Limits (Tentative Addendum No. 1 to Order No. R9-2011-0019) (*Joann Lim*).

A motion was made by Gary Strawn and seconded by Tomas Morales to adopt the Addendum. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Destache called a recess at 10:20 a.m., and the meeting reconvened at 10:35 a.m.

<u>Item 9</u> – Public Hearing: Consideration of Tentative Order No. R9-2012-0024 and Draft Technical Report, naming as Dischargers BAE Systems San Diego Ship Repair, Inc., Campbell Industries, City of San Diego, National Steel and Shipbuilding Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, San Diego Unified Port District, and United States Navy, for the San Diego Bay Shipyard Sediment Cleanup Project, San Diego County. The San Diego Water Board may adopt, modify or reject the Tentative Order or may continue the hearing or action on the Tentative Order to a later (April 11, 2012, or some other) date. The San Diego Water Board may deliberate on the evidence received during this hearing as provided in the notice of Closed Session, Item 12, below. (*Frank Melbourn*)

The meeting reconvened at 2:12 p.m., and the Board discussed Items 8 and 9.

The Advisory Team presented an additional change to Tentative Order No. R9-2012-0024 requested by the Board.

Mr. Anderson made a motion to adopt Resolution No. R9-2012-0025 and the Environmental Impact Report, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Strawn. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Strawn made a motion to adopt Tentative Order No. R9-2012-0024 and the Draft Technical Report naming the Dischargers, with Errata; the motion was seconded by Dr. Abarbanel. There was some Board discussion thanking the Cleanup Team, the Advisory Team, the stakeholders, and the public for their participation in the process; a vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.
