MINUTES OF MEETING APRIL 11, 2012

At 9:00 a.m. Chairman Destache called to order the meeting of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) at the City of Mission Viejo Council Chambers, 200 Civic Center, Mission Viejo, California 92691.

<u>Item 1</u> – Roll Call and Introductions <u>Board Members Present:</u> Grant Destache, Eric Anderson, Gary Strawn, Tomas Morales, and Henry Abarbanel.

Michael Beanan of the South Laguna Civic Association spoke regarding the Laguna Bluebelt, a marine life protection organization in Laguna Beach.

Penny Elia of the Sierra Club spoke regarding the MS4 permit and Aliso Creek runoff.

Item 4 – Chairman's, Board Members', State Water Board liaison's, and Executive Officer's Reports: These items are for Board discussion only. No public testimony will be allowed, and the Board will take no formal action.

Ms. Spivy-Weber commented on State Board and budget issues.

Mr. Gibson commented on the Executive Officer's report.

Mr. Destache commented on the Chairman's meetings in Sacramento in March.

Item 3 – Minutes of Board Meetings: February 8, 2012; March 14, 2012. These records of the minutes of the meetings on these dates are not intended as the official records of events and are solely for administrative convenience. A motion was made by Mr. Abarbanel and seconded by Mr. Morales to adopt the minutes of the previous meetings. A vote was taken and all the Board Members present unanimously approved the minutes of the previous meetings.

Consent Calendar: Item 5 is considered a non-controversial issue. (NOTE: If there is public interest, concern, or discussion regarding any consent calendar item or a request for a public hearing, then the item(s) will be removed from the consent calendar and considered after all other agenda items have been completed.)

<u>Item 5</u> – Resolution: Nomination of Santa Ysabel Chevron Station site to State Emergency, Abandoned and Recalcitrant Account Annual Site List (Tentative Resolution No. R9-2012-0034) (*Sue Pease*).

A motion was made by Mr. Anderson and seconded by Dr. Abarbanel to adopt the Resolution. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

Remainder of the Agenda (Non-Consent Items):

Item 6 – Informational Item: Update from the Three Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Groups, Laurie Walsh introduced the presentations.

Ed Pech, Department of Water Resources, provided an overview of the program.

Maryanne Skorpanich, Orange County IRWM Group, made a presentation about the South Orange County Watershed Management Area.

Ms. Skorpanich responded to Board questioning about priority projects and their funding sources for the South Orange County Watershed Management Group.

Mr. Destache commented that Orange County's approach to water resource management emphasizes his theory that the Board needs to plan to act in lieu of spending a lot of time planning. Therefore, it is critical to get in and start cleaning up the streams in order to be effective. <u>Further, the Board as a whole expressed concern that successful implementation of the various projects is critical to the IRWM effort. While planning seems to be going well, implementation should proceed a more rapid pace.</u>

Sheri McPherson, County of San Diego, gave a presentation on the San Diego IRWM program.

Ms. McPherson responded to Board questioning regarding the percentage of funding available to nonprofit groups and nongovernmental organizations; the method of notifying citizens that projects are available for review and how to achieve broader public participation in these projects; and the idea of a work group exchange.

Denise Landstedt of the Rancho California Water District gave a presentation about the Upper Santa Margarita Watershed Planning Region.

Ms. Landstedt responded to Board inquiries about the percentage of stakeholders that are recreational users; how the Rancho California Water District had implemented and maintained a stakeholder relationship with the Native American communities in the area; what impact the agricultural community had had on their planning strategies; and what they were doing to develop local sources.

Mark Stadler of the San Diego County Water Authority, Manager of the San Diego IRWM Program, spoke about the San Diego Funding Area Coordinating Committee.

The Board questioned Mr. Pech regarding communication concerns with the Tri-Pac(?)—the three funding groups in San Diego county.

Michael Beanan, Vice President of the South Laguna Civic Association, made comments about the Integrated Watershed Management Plan and its impacts on the Aliso Watershed.

The Board recessed for lunch and Closed Session at 11:20 a.m. and reconvened at 12:40 p.m.

Item 7 – NPDES Permit Reissuance: South Orange County Waste Authority, Discharges to the Pacific Ocean via San Juan Creek Ocean Outfall, Orange County (Tentative Order No. R9-2012-0012, NPDES No. CA0107417) (*Joann Lim*). After the Chair opened the public hearing, staff (Joann Lim) made a presentation about the proposed order.

Brennon Flahive of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority (SOCWA) commented on the proposed order.

The Board questioned staff and SOCWA about the proposed order.

Richard Gardner of South Coast Water District commented on the proposed order.

Penny Elia of the Sierra Club commented on the proposed order.

The Board questioned SOCWA further about the proposed order.

The Chair closed the public hearing. After Board deliberation, a motion was made by Dr. Abarbanel and seconded by Mr. Strawn to adopt the Order. A vote was taken and all the Board members present unanimously adopted the Order.

After the Chair opened the public hearing, staff (Joann Lim) made a presentation about the proposed order. Staff and presenters incorporated some portions of their presentations on Item 7 into the record for Item 8 to avoid repetition.

Michael Beanan of the South Laguna Civic Association commented on the proposed order.

Richard Gardner of Capistrano Beach commented on the proposed order.

Rick Wilson of Surfrider Foundation, San Clemente, commented on the proposed order.

Penny Elia of the Sierra Club commented on the proposed order.

David Pedersen, Executive Director or Operations for Irvine Ranch Water District, commented on the proposed order.

Tom Rosales, General Manager of SOCWA, commented on the proposed order.

The public hearing was closed. After Board deliberation, a motion was made by Mr. Morales and seconded by Mr. Strawn to adopt the Order. A vote was taken and all the Board Members present unanimously adopted the Order.
