> MINUTES OF MEETING AUGUST 8, 2012

At 9:00 a.m. Chairman Destache called to order the meeting of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) at the Regional Water Quality Control Board, 9174 Sky Park Court, San Diego, California.

Item 1 – Roll Call and Introductions

Item 2 – Public Forum

The Board presented Lori Costa with a Superior Accomplishment award.

Geoff Mok, Contech Engineered Solutions, spoke regarding a rainwater harvesting system marketed by his company.

Item 3 – Minutes of Board Meeting: April 11, 2012, June 13, 2012.

The adoption of the minutes was tabled until a later time.

<u>Item 4</u> – Chairman's, Board Members', State Water Board liaison's and Executive Officer's Reports: These items are for Board discussion only. No public testimony will be allowed, and the Board will take no formal action.

Chairman Destache reminded Board members that the WQCC meeting is coming up in November.

Mr. Strawn reported favorably on staff member Sean McClain's report to the San Diego River Conservancy Board. In addition, Mr. Strawn reported that through his work with the San Diego River Watershed Monitoring Work Group, he has identified a self-sustaining population of wild trout in the upper San Diego River watershed. Most of that property is publicly owned, but access is restricted by a few private parcels. So, the River Park has purchased a 2.5 acre parcel, including approximately 800 feet of Boulder Creek, which they intend to maintain as a water monitoring site.

Dr. Abarbanel spoke about a meeting with the San Dieguito Lagoon JPA and asked for an Information Item to be placed on a future Agenda. He also asked for more stakeholder participation in Board decisions.

Mr. Gibson made a presentation on the Practical Vision process, and asked for Board participation in the final stages of editing the Practical Vision document before it is presented in its final form at a later Board meeting.

<u>Item 5</u> – Information Item: Southern California Bight Regional Monitoring Program (*Bruce Posthumus*).

Mr. Posthumus introduced Ken Schiff, who made a Power Point presentation about the Southern California Bight Regional Monitoring Program.

Chairman Destache called a recess at 10:10 a.m. and reconvened at 10:25 a.m.

<u>Item 6</u> – Information Item: Richard Atwater, Executive Director of the Southern California Water Committee, discussed Storm Water Capture Opportunities to increase public water supplies in Southern California (*Laurie Walsh*).

Mr. Atwater made a Power Point presentation regarding Storm Water Capture Opportunities in the San Diego Region.

<u>Item 7</u> – Tentative Resolution: A Resolution Requesting Disbursement from the Cleanup and Abatement Account for the San Diego Unified Port District A-8 Anchorage Marine Debris Removal Project (Tentative Resolution No. R9-2012-0053) (*Eric Becker*).

Eileen Maher, Port of San Diego, spoke in favor of the proposed resolution.

Mr. Loveland moved to adopt the Tentative Resolution with the understanding that Mr. Gibson would negotiate a grant agreement requiring specific performance parameters, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Anderson. The Board voted to adopt the Resolution, with the exception of Dr. Abarbanel, who voted against the Resolution. The motion passed.

Chairman Destache called a recess for lunch and Closed Session at 11:20 a.m. and reconvened the meeting at 12:40 p.m.

The Board considered a revised version of the April minutes.

Dr. Abarbanel moved to adopt the minutes of the April and June Board meetings, the motion was seconded by Mr. Loveland, and the Board voted unanimously to adopt the minutes.

Items 8 and 9 were taken together.

<u>Item 8</u> – NPDES Permit Reissuance: Fallbrook Public Utility District, Plant No. 1, Discharge to Pacific Ocean via the Oceanside Ocean Outfall (Tentative Order No. R9-2012-0004, NPDES Permit No. CA0108031) (*Ben Neill*).

Mr. Neill made the staff presentation regarding the proposed orders.

Brian Brady of the Fallbrook Public Utility District spoke in opposition to the proposed orders.

Jack Bebee, Engineering and Planning Manager for the Fallbrook Public Utility District, spoke in opposition to the proposed orders.

Melissa Thorme of Downey Brand, representing the Fallbrook Public Utility District, spoke in opposition to the proposed orders.

After Board discussion and deliberation, a motion to adopt the Tentative Order was made by Mr. Strawn and seconded by Dr. Abarbanel, and the Board adopted it by a 4-2 vote. Mr. Loveland and Chair Destache voted against the motion.

<u>Item 9</u> – Time Schedule Order: Fallbrook Public Utility District, Discharge to Pacific Ocean via the Oceanside Ocean Outfall: An Order Establishing an

After Board discussion and deliberation, Mr. Morales moved to adopt the Tentative Order, the motion was seconded by Mr. Loveland, and the Board voted to adopt the Order.
