MINUTES OF MEETING SEPTEMBER 10, 2014

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Abarbanel called to order the meeting of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) at the Regional Water Quality Control Board, 2375 Northside Drive, San Diego, California.

Item 1 - Roll Call and Introductions

<u>Item 2</u> – Public Forum

Mike Palmer, Project Coordinator for De Maximis, Inc., provided an update on the Chatham Brothers Barrel Yard plume in Escondido. Ms. Warren recused herself and stepped away from the dais during this time.

Item 3 - Minutes of Board Meeting: August 13, 2014

Mr. Morales moved to adopt the minutes, and Mr. Strawn seconded the motion. Mr. Anderson abstained, as he did not attend the meeting. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote of those who did attend the meeting.

<u>Item 4</u> – Chairman's, Board Members', State Water Board Liaison's, and Executive Officer's Reports. These items are for Board discussion only. No public testimony will be allowed, and the Board will take no formal action.

Mr. Strawn thanked staff for their activities to help with the children's fishing program. He also spoke about a cleanup at the Encina Wastewater Authority, where they are creating high-grade commercial fertilizer from sludge.

Dr. Abarbanel announced that at the Water Quality Coordinating Committee (WQCC) meeting in early October, there will be an item on the agenda regarding protection and recovery of wetlands, which has been driven by the views of this Board and is the purpose of the large information item on today's agenda.

Mr. Gibson provided a summary of the Tijuana River Valley Recovery Team meeting on August 27, 2014. In addition, he answered Board member questions regarding the written Executive Officer's Report.

Dr. Abarbanel presented staff member Amy Grove with an award recognizing her for exemplary work.

<u>Item 5</u> – Future Agenda Items: Board Members may discuss items for possible inclusion on future agendas. No action will be taken. (*David Gibson*)

Ms. Kalemkiarian asked that the Board consider having an annual or biannual water quality summit to bring together municipal stakeholders and community organizations in a more informal setting than a regular Board meeting.

Dr. Abarbanel requested that staff invite the copermittees, including Orange County and Riverside County to provide information on what they are doing to educate the public about the MS4 permit requirements.

<u>Item 6</u> – Information Item: Update on Current and Planned Research by the Southern California Coastal Water Research Project (SCCWRP). (*David Gibson*)

Ken Schiff provided background information on SCCWRP, outlined their research projects, and answered Board member questions.

<u>Item 7</u> – Information Item: Preview of the USEPA Border 2020 Conference. (*David Gibson*)

Douglas Liden provided a summary of Border 2020 goals and projects and responded to questions from Board members.

The Chairman called a brief recess at 10:27 a.m. and reconvened the meeting at 10:38 a.m.

<u>Item 8</u> – Information Item: Public Workshop on the State of Wetlands in the San Diego Region: Protection and Restoration Potential. (*Kelly Dorsey*)

Kelly Dorsey provided an overview of the item and introduced the speakers.

Bill Orme of the State Water Board discussed the State Water Board's Wetland Protection Policy and responded to Board member questions

Dr. Eric Stein of SCCWRP gave a presentation on wetland types, historical loss, and tracking future trends and answered questions from Board members.

The Chairman recessed for lunch and Closed Session at 11:57 a.m. Ms. Hagan stated that the Board would discuss the Petition of Foothill/Eastern Transportation Corridor Agency during Closed Session. The Chairman reconvened the public meeting at 1:07 p.m.

Raphael Mazor of SCCWRP spoke about tools and approaches for examining regionally under-represented water body types and non-perennial streams.

Chad Loflen of the Board staff gave a presentation on Forrester Creek, and discussed measures of success and lessons learned from that restoration project. He also responded to Board member questions.

Ken Schiff discussed biological objectives and answered questions from Board members.

The Chairman called a brief recess at 2:35 p.m. and reconvened the meeting at 2:42 p.m.

Dr. Richard Ambrose of UCLA talked about how to effectively mitigate for wetland impacts and replied to Board member questions.

Mary Small, Deputy Director of the California Coastal Conservancy, discussed the Wetland Recovery Project and responded to Board member questions.

Ms. Dorsey closed the item with a discussion of priorities for the future and by answering questions from Board members.
