

Naval Outlying Landing Field (NOLF), Underground Storage Tank 2 – NEX Gas Station, Imperial Beach, California

The U.S. Department of the Navy has issued a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) for an unauthorized release of petroleum fuel wastes from a leaking underground storage tank system at NOLF Underground Storage Tank No. 2, Building 158 – NEX Gas Station Imperial Beach, California (site). This public notice fulfills the San Diego Water Board's obligation to inform the public of corrective action plan as required by California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 16, Article 11, section 2728.

The public notification period ends on March 13, 2020. The CAP recommends three additional years of groundwater and soil vapor monitoring, soil sampling in the source area, a preferential pathway assessment, and land use controls.
