Dear Chairman Wright and Board Members:

In 2006, I wrote the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board requesting support for the Carlsbad Desalination Project. Today, I ask that the Regional Board reaffirm its support for the project.

When the Regional Board unanimously approved the project's discharge permit in August 2006, it attached a condition that the permit include a Flow, Entrainment and Impingement Minimization Plan to help reduce impacts to the marine environment. I fully support this condition.

This minimization plan has been prepared and available for your review for the past year. The discharge permit and related minimization plan offer far-reaching design, technology and mitigation measures that will ensure that the plant is operated in a manner consistent with state law.

As Chair of the Senate Committee on Energy, Utilities and Communications and as a longtime member of the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Water, I know how important it is to have a reliable local water supply to serve the San Diego region's needs. This important project has enjoyed the unanimous support of the San Diego's state legislative delegation as expressed in a letter to the California Coastal Commission when they considered the issuance of the project's coastal development permit this past summer.
